Hereas in these our dates, (wherein the light of the glorious Gospell begins to reuiue and spring a fresh) there be many poynts called into controuers in the results of the many one (Most noble Prince) more difficult, or less agreed you have the asset when that question and the many one of the served you by such as write, then that question

which concerneth Antichrift. The knowledge whereof, although it be most necessarie, both for the understanding of that truth which God himfelfe hath reueiled, & exceeding profitable for the flaie of the Church : yet in this poynt the opinions of the auncient Fathers, have bene so variable and diners, that we are almost altogether to feeke, what we are to follow and hould in this behalfe. And this diversitie of theirs, came to passe by this meanes, partly, for that they lined in those dayes wherein all the marks and tokens of this Iniquitie, (the which notwithstanding the Spirit of God bewraied and poynted out beforehand) were not manifest, as not come to light (for as yet Antichrift was not come to his height or perfection:) and partlie also for that the minds of men were to fore-statled by prejudice of an other matter, and fo dazeled, yea and blinded with the glorious Thewe of the Sea of Rome: that they could never bee perswaded that such mischief could possibly energife from thence. And although in time by little and little, those foresaid tokens began to appeare and thew themselves, whereby that horrible Monster might be differred; and with all although that Sea it felfe began now in that behalfe to bee suspected by manie : yet so greatwas the dreadfull power and authoritie of the Bishop of Rome, that they who had espied the light of the truth, durit not for their lines mutter or (peake the least word, For if they did, they were by and by not onlie condemned in the next Synods

Synods as Scismaticks, but also put to death by Magistrates as Heretieks more pefulent and hay nous then any that euer lived. And to by meanes of feare and terrour they held their tongues. Nowithstanding, in the time of our Auncestours, namelie about the yeare 350, when Lee the first was Bishop of Rome: one Hilarians Bilhop of Vienna in France, did openlie gaine-fale the tyPannie of the Roman Bishop which then began to advaunce and enlarge it felf. After that, about 400. yeares ago there arose one Arnold in Italie, surnamed Brixianas, who with strong arguments and vehement perswalions (for he was a man accompted for his time both learned and eloquent) handled plainelie, and vrged pithilie this poynt and that verie commonlie, publicklie and euen in the midft of the Cittie of Rome itself : by which his labours and force of the truth, he moved manie indeed, but yet generallie he could not prenaile.

So great a coule t'was alwaies found.

To plucke the Romish Sea to ground, In fo much as one Bernardus Clarenallenfis (a man who otherwise stoode not so greatlie affected to the tirannie of the Romaine Billiop; yet by meanes that men in those dayes were generallic fo bewirched with a renerend opinion of the Maiestie of that Sea:) tooke you him to toffe, and canuaffe that centure of Arnolds although it were most true and just, And this auncient and receased opinion touching the facred authoritie of the Biftop of Rome, continewed many ge. nerations and was never in the meane time controlled by anie, fane onlie the Greeke Bishops, and that but by afew of them. And in truth therein the Greciens shewed themselnes to bee of a more free judgement, and wifer disposition then were our men , and the Bishop of the Latine Churches , for they (as appeareth by the writings of Nilus Billiop of Theffalonica, an eloquent man) carneftly anouched that Antichriftwas not onelie come and feated in the Church of God bne. that the Bishop of Rome himself was the very partie, and this they enforced with fuch pregnant and firong proofes:as the best proctours that ever that Sea had, were never able as yet. to enerthrow, But as for the Westerne Bishops , they indeed

difagreed in this pointe, but not your anie good ground or fetled judgement, but only caried away by the prejudice of commó custome:nay, they being deceived by the great subtilty of Satan (who now begato worke the milterie of iniquitie as Paule had fore-tould) proceeded further, and gaue their helping hand to the spreding abroad of that pestilent infectio (the suppression whereof it behooved each christian to have endeuoured) and very busie and pettish they were in helping and vpholding it, and in putting Oyle as you would faie, to the fire. And so in processe of time the said Bishop of Rome became as big as a Briareus (as it is in the Prouetbe) who be- a Monfirous fore was as little as a foolish Leueret. At first in verie deed, vn. Giant which der the raigne of the Henries, and after of the Fredericks, Em- had a hundred perours of Germanie the Kingdome of Antichrist received Ames. great firength and encroched vpon the confciences of men of all fortes. For although euen from the daies of the Apofiles themselues, Sathan began to lay the foundation thereof, vet by reason of the bright shining light of the Gospel, which in those dayes was kept in all integritie in the Churche, hee tooke repulse, and so by meanes of the worke which GOD himfelfhad(as it were) newly proclaimed and taken in hand he was inforced to be quiet & to defer his busines vnto some other time. Afterwards, looke what he had long fince begon and fomewhat brought forward hee found the meanes to fi-

Faber, Cochley and fuch other prating lackes, of the like stampe, by whose toyle-some tranailes, mingled with capills, coggs, and couzning trickes. the cause was a while cherished and vpheald. But God, the father of all mercies, in great compassion, pitying the estate of the world; vouchfafed in this old-age thereof to raife and fend amongst vs the light of his glorious Gospel: the power whereof, is the onlie inftrument to bring Antichrift vnderfoote. Therefore, he lightened the minds of our vnderstandings, displayed the foggie Mists of Antichristian darknes, and shirred vp his worthy servaunts, as valiaunt Champions, to bruse and breake, to quell and kil the power of Antichrist. Doubtieffe that erronious reading which Auguffine follower, beed a great errour : for thereupon fome haue in fuch fort interpreted this place, as if Paule hab fpoken of one onely man (whome he fo pointed out, and tearmed him only by the name of Antichaill) and not of a whole broode or bobie of a multitube. But both the meaning of Paule, reafon it felfe, and the iffue of things can in no wife abmit this reabing of expolition. For Paule fpeaketh not of any one man, but of a crewe cluffered together, an affembly, and king offraternitie of men agreed and fwozne together, in hogrible and: blafphemous manner, againft Goo himfelfe, Cherefore be: bleth the primatine word Apoltalie : and after in the twelfth berle be unfolbeth himfelfe, and fpeaketh plainely in the plisrall number, That all they might be damned &c.

Agayne, reafon it felfe inforceth , that it cannot bee binber. food of one man, but of a multitube and kingdome. for one. and the felfe-fame man, cannot poffiblicitie fo many peares. as there were betweene the bates of Paule, and the onerthrow of the Romane Empyre, after which the bery Antichaff mas to come.

Laftip, the euent hereof veclareth that it is to be underflot bniuerfally of the effate of the Church e of the whole worlo, the which bath continued many ages, and as pet is in bre, and not of the life or age of any one man : For the life of one man (though be were of a great age) is but thort if it be compared mith the time of this Defection, which bath lafted now full out 900 peares . And as touching this Apollacie, or falling awap , it is a wofull or molt miferable Eftate , or condition of mies tobich figurio cake place in the world before the fecono

Lattip, it is marranted by the I John Cap, 2, verf. 18, where it is apnerans that thename of Antichrift is attributed to many. Chon the which place Daifter Caluin witcth thus. Paule (The (413 .) fposking of the Apollacie , or falling away. that floridd infine platitude gigeth it out that it should bee abodic or asyon would fay a kingdome of defection.

then they be among the Dinines . The Civill law tearmeth that Soulvier an Apoffate, which flieth from hie Campe, and mith-braweth himfelfe from the alleagiance that he oweth to his Captaine. So both Modeftinus the Lawper witte in L. Deferiores, D. dere milita:] for he termeth him a Runnagate, and Apollate Souldier, who hath been fraggling long

from his tents, although after he be bjought back agapne. But among the Diuines [L. Apostata C.de Apostatis] Apollates are otherwife accompted ; naniely, fuch as betrap and renounce their holie and Christian profession once made and received. On the other fibe, the Schwie-men and Papiffd bo pet make an other rechoning of Apoltates, and befrribe them to bee fuch an breake the rule and leaue the orber of religion, the which with a bow they once toke boon them . But Doubtleffe in this place of Paule which we haue nom in hand. be neither talketh of Militarie bifcipline , nor of Popiff profellians, which as pet were not hatchen. Therefore the Apoflacie or pefection that he fpeaketh of here , muft needes bee binberftwo either of a beparting from the Chaiftian faith, or from fubication under the Empris of Rome. And in beebe, fome haue unberftod it of the Romane Emppre, (as Lattantius lib.7 .cap. 15. August , lib. 20. De cinitate Dei. cap. 19, fea rom ad Algaf, queft. 11.) which opinion how true it is, let be configer . To fpeake briefly in the poput, this is my inoge. ment, that this place of Paule cannot bee meant only of the Empyreof Rome, and that in many refprete . firft, Paule intreateth not in that place of earthly hingbomes, or chaunge of Common wealthes , but belinereth boctrine touching Christian faith. Agapne, the iffue of the matter (which is the bell expolitour of this prophecie that can be) both theme no leffe. For the kingbome of Antichaift was not fo much a withbrawing of Subjection from the Romane Emppre, as a benp. ing of obedience bnto the wood of God . Further, Damafcen (lib,4.cap. 27.de orchodoxa fide) maketh for me, affirming that Antichrift thould come after that the bottrine of the Sofpell were once fpread abroad . Laftly , all the auncient fathers,

when once they affirme that Antichielt himlelfe is alreadic come, by and by, for profestereof, they make inflance of the herefies which he maintained contrair to found bottine, not mentioning any fertion or inflancerion of the fluiters agapult the faceto Paietlie of the Romane Empyle.

Therefore this Apollacie, which is the ground and piller of the efface of Antichill, is a back-fliving or beparture from

the true bodrine of Chailtian faith.

UThy the kingdome and state of Antichrist is by the Spirit of God, indefinitely, or without limitation called an Apostacie.

The fixt Chapter.

Paule tearmeth it by a generall worde Apollacie , he giueth be thereby to underflant, that this beparting thould not fall out in one or two Churches only, but in the tobole booie (as it is called) of the butuerfall and bilible Church. And therefore Paule fpeaketh without circumfcription, for furb invefts nite fpeaches are aunfwerable in quantitie to bniuerfals, as the Logicians teache. And this is confirmed and mabe plaine by that in the Revelation, where the whose is fait to make Dinnike with her pollonen cup, not only one Church or 19:0. uince, but all the Kings, Mations, & inhabitants of the whole wollb. And pet not euery pertifular man aub member of the Church of God fhall become a back-fliver, (for God will alwapes heepe fome onto himfelfe, even in the mioff of that ge. nerall petertion, as he wie fire thouland in the bapes of Eliah who were the true Chinch) but an incorporation (an pou monto fap) a confpiracie, and the greater nomber of fuch as thoulb challenge unto themfelues the name of the Church of Bob , fhall bepart from the faith of Chrift, and fhall betake them to a Doctrine cleane contrarie thereunto , and this to be hone every where, ovenly, by common confent, and publike authoritie : the which we fee to be bone in Turkie, in Mahumetifine, and in Popery. From hence therefore we may mas ther two points worthy the knowledge and observation : the first, that, that argument is not fo firong and unaunfwerable to perfwade the truth of any doctrine, which is taken from long continuance and tradition of our Cloers, For whe once this generall befection thall have fet in foote, bow may a manthen fafely make this collection, This doctrine is true, and Apostolike, because it is publikely received, taught, and allowed commonly in every Congregation. For Paule both faid that it fould come to palle, that a porteme contrarie to that of the Gofpell Gould be abinitted, pea, and that with approbation, into the bery Churches in enery place, publike. Ip. Indecor the auncient Whiters were wont to ble this argument (of fucceffion and confent :) and befoge this befection it was both a forcible, and found kinde of proofe : but how, it's nothing fo. The fecond is that a man can not rightly nather and conclube, that the true Church and true Doctrine is there to be found, where there hath bin inuiolably kept and obferued a continuall and opperly fuccellion of perfons. For feeing this Defection was to take place and continue long in the bery Church of Gob, euen through many fucceffions of perfons and ages of men : how may a manthenre gathet and conclube lubifantially, that therefore the Church of Bob is to he found in the miot of thele back-flivers, beraufe that there are to be feene a continuall fucceffion of perfons, whereas thole perfons be the berie Apoltates themfelues.

Latty, from there may be oblicated, that this is a falle position in poperie, which not withflanding the Schools-men maintaine with tail, and naill, namely, that the Church can moterer way, it is certain that to can, and that not only one pericular Church, or two, but many pluttiff Congregation, pas, whole Countaines, and to make thost, the butterful Church; teller, whole The church teller, cannot be made that the church teller, and to make thost.

Daule proceedeth further, and abbeth, and that man of finne : heerebe fpeaketh directly and plainely of Antichaift : as firft of his name, and then of his perfon, or of his qualitie and voctrine. Couching bis name, be tearmeth him, The man of finne, and Sonne of perdition. And bere againe , that is called into quellion, whereof I have alreadie bilbutet, namely, where as Paule calleth Antichrift a man. whether it be to be underftobe of any one prinate man that fhouth litte in the mould at fome one time or other, or eile of the whole rabble of men in their fuccellions , which in that Apoliacie flouid beare a fwinoge for many peares, whome Paule likeneth to a man, and fo tearmeth it in the fingular nomber : although in truth it be a troupe and crewe, gatheren and compact together of many men, yea, of all the nations e kingbomes of the meals, In like manner as Paule, 1, Cor. 4. I. by man in the fingular nomber unberftanbeth many, which tunbe of freache is bluall and familiar to luch as follow the thebrew phrase, the which Paule in his writings both creatly affect and imitate.

But withall, this is viligently to be oblerued, which Da-

mafcen affirmeth, namely, that Antichill foule not be one of the Diuels that thould take bpon bim the fielh and fubflance of man (euen as our Saufour tooke buto him our humane nature) although notwithstanding fuch as should become Antichiffs, thoulo be poffeffeb with a biuelith bifpolition, and carted in enmitte againft God. Eruth it is, the Papills will haue it binderfimbe of one fingular and painate man, who one bap thould live and keepe a firre, and further, that he fould arife out of the tribe of Dan : but in this their botage, thep relie boon no around of Scripture, and therefore they are bumete in this point to be bealt mithall. Dthers there are (and that learned men to) that are of opinion that this is to be buberftwe indebe of one man, but fuch an one, as among all the route of Apoftates, foulo be the moft peruerle, the chiefe, and ring-leader of all the reft ; for (far thep) there is one head of the gooly and faithfull, euen Chill Jelus. And touthing the name of this one principall, a arch-Apoffata; they thinke it is as well couertip infinuated in this place of Paule, as alfo especially beimaped in the 13, of the Reuclation, verf, 18, wherethe figures & letters of the fait name are fait to make up the number of 666, And (to fay the truth) this opinion is generally receined, and feemeth to be fomewhat likely. Unto thefe points I will apprelle mine anfwere. And firft touching the firft. Although it be very true, that there is one principall bead of all the unfaithfull, pet he is not any perticular @ moztall man (fuch as it appeareth Math, 24. that famous antichrift fhoulo be) but euen Sathan himfelfe, that olo Serpent, who allo is called the Dragon. And as for the fecond opinis on, me thinks it is weake and wavereth in it felfe, in as much as that place of the Apocalypie, cap. 13. verf, 18. is miongly interipeten of amp certaine name, title , or calling of any one man; the letters whereof foulb conteine the number of 666, For the Spirit of Bob in that place medleth not with the A. rithmeticali fianification of letters wherewith any word is frametribut of the time and number of yeares wherein those things thould be accomplifted that are there luoken of. For D 3

the Acripture neuer bleth to beale in fuch manner of Sorer. a folith motters by letters, which is but flat jungling of the Cabalifts, and bammed botages of the Magicians : but. it be feth to fpeake very plainely, when it fore-telleth of the comming of any, as namely, when it fore-theweth the comming of Cyrus and Iolias, and that an hundled peares before thep came indeene. Therefore looke what men are any where by the Spirit of Bou fpoken of , they be mentioned binber their plaine, proper, and peculiar names, and not by fuch circum. flance of moros : as, Cyrus, Iofias, Iefus Chriftec, as I faib before. And to the end we map the better fee into the matter, let be eramme the morbe of the tert it felfe, Reuel, 13. verl. 18, Heere is wifedome. Let him that hath vnderflanding, coumpt the nomber of the Beaft, for it is the nomber of a man, and his nomber is fixe hundred threefcore and fixe.

Main I moule Demaund of what tonque,or language that mors or name thould be, the letters whereof muit be fearthen after, whether it fould be an Erebrem, Grete on Latin more: for (as Auguft affirmeth, lib. 12.de Genefi ad literam) thele three languages were alwaies accommuted principall among al men. Cruely they that firft brought by that interpretation, whereof I fpeake (as namely Irenaus lib. s.) no euen folter in the marter, and labour their mittes in beuiling amp one word. whose letters would amount unto the number of 666. And pet Enfebius (lib. s. biffer.cap 8.) followeth that which he fate Ireneus to haue fet bowne before him: I could mp felle beuile many fuch morbes, but it mould bee to no purpole. For this name Claudius Ruber , containes the like number that thele bo Italica, Ecclefia, Lateinos, Teitan: the which neverthe. Leffe Irenaus thinkerh (bould be the bery nomes of chis egregious Antichiel. Agapne, the ancient writers before o baies of Ireneus fetthing the matter out of the Greeke, affirmes that this word harriver, and thefe two irahina annancia Gould be meant, which fould make by the number 666, namely the letter A: to lignifie 30, a: 1, 7: 300, 4: 5.1: 10, #: 50.#: 70. c: 200. For these numbers being abbed together amount buto 666. And that fomme also is contained in the two other words , according to the Greekill manner of fupputation or numbring by letters, 1: 10. 7: 300, a: 1, h: 30. 1: 10, k: 20. a: 1, 1: 5, N: 20, N: 20, A: 30, N: 8, 0: 200, I: 10, a: 1, al which likewife being put together make 666. And no boubt but the truth of the thing, bee and follered this opinion in them. Far in the Italian Church (the bead whereof the Citie of Rome alwaies was) they fame before their eyes, that the perp kingbome of Antichift began then to be reiede's, and fo by fuch beginnings as then appeared , the Spirit of ODD muiben thole goo men to fore-lee and fore-fheme , that there allo in time it would grow to his height and perfection. And as touching frenens himfelfe,he rather thought that the word Taray, fould bee the proper name of Antichift . Wereunta may be abbed the Debrew word Romuch : which fignifieth a Romain: whereof the letter -: fignifieth (in their manner of numbering alfo) 200, 7:6, 3:40, 7: 10, 7: 10, 7: 400, But thefe are but quibotties : and come not nere the true ervolltion of that place of the Apoc. which I alleadged : the which that wee may attaine buto, wee muft make recourse buto the holie Scriptures, and buto fuch like places as this is. as namely buto that of Daniell, cap. 7. where not only one perticular man, but a tobole and briuerfall ftate of a hinerborne. is fet forth buber the name and thape of a Beatt, as here of a man . So the kingbome and all the Kings of Perfia are fhas nomen unber the figure of one Beare : of the Macedonians buber the fhape of a Leonard. So allo all fuch as fhould bie the principalles and hold the helme (as you would fay) in that Apollarie, are refembled by the name of a Beaft in the findus lar number. Tathereby it appeareth, that this place of the Apocis to be referred unto the whole manner and continuance of a certaine fucceffion, and not unto any one man. Laftip.ic is not to bee boubten but that by thefe wordes (the man of finne,&c.) the prerogatines and Potentates in this Apolla. cie are poputed out.

Anothis fave ing of Lactanzius agreeth fitly with that of the Reuel, (cap. 17.6.) where Antichtiff is laye to bee that Harlot , that is made monken with the bloud of Partyrs , and Saincts of Gob, Mibereby appeareth that Antichill fhoulo (as he both) alwaies ratie bloudy perfecutions against o faithful, (hrifast . (Hom.40.on Math.) Affirmeth no leffe, now tourbing this leffe, now touching this matter of perfecution , when , or by whome was it ever more martiled, then it bath bin, and fil is. by the Billion of Rome, and that whole retinem? and let this fuffice brieflie, to be fooken of the crueltie of this acheration. Concerning the ignorance of it : I finde it thus written in a booke intituled De Antichrifto and attributed buto Auflin: The kingdome of Antichrilt shall be furnished with Magicians, Witches, Southfayers and Inchaunters, which Shall teach and perfwave with all manner of impierie, falle. hood and betelfable pactiles.

And where (I pray) may this be found more beriffen , than among the Bavilles, and in the kingbome of Bonerie, And fure the Bouill Clerate (which is the mapne piller of this Bate and Apoffacie) being beferibed by Peter in his 2. But thefe ten were after abridmen and brought unto two : for afterwards there were but two hornes of the Romane Empire, that is two Princes feates, or places of reficencie; whereof the first and most aunsient mag at Rome in Italie, the fecond and fatter at Bizantism, otherwife called Conft antinople in Thracia, whether Conftantine the Great tranffaten bis mantion or abibing place: whereupon it came to paffe, that both in menerall Counfels. and in the Decrees of Emperours, mention is of two Romes: one, the olde, which is the true Rome, built by Romulus : the other, the new, which is Conftantinople, which allo began to balbe up the bead, by vertue of the privilences a preronative of olde Rome. But betweene thefe ting hornes of this one. and the fame Romane Empire this was the Difference, which atfo is of be biligently to be observed, that fo long as the home (or feate) was in Italie, the Romanc Emperours were Ibalatours, and their Derrees and Conftitutions blafphe. mous aceinft Gob, But after time, the faid Emperours began to be Chriftians, which began in Conftantine the great, (for whereas fome writers affirme of Phillip, whome Decius fleme, that he imbraced the Golbell, certaine it is, that he mouto be a Chriftian no otherwife but couertly, and not by publike profession) then I fap first of all, and by and by bpost the nethe of it , this fame Romane Empire was tranflated from Italie; aut old Rome into Thrace, and therein unto Conffantinople. For that this thould to come to palle, the Spirit of God in the Apoc. had forc-fbewed, as after we fhall betlare. Cliby map fome fap, bid encrthe Pope caufe men to worthin any of the Romane Emperours, fuccially a. np of thole that were Tholatours : Thercunto I auniwere. that by the name of Image, (which by him is quicknep) not the perfens of the Emperours are fignified that mabe their abobe at Rome : but rather by that name was meant and fpecifich the State e fourme of the Romane Empire (I meane, the Italifb, and Toolatrous Empire) the which being flarke beab. the Pope hath againe raised and made whole in cuery point. For even at this houre the kingbome of Boverie both as lively reprefent the ould flate of Ibolatrie, as if it were fpit out of the mouth of it, the which every man may callly verexide by the comparing of them both together, and by the feuerall inflances which beereafter infue.

The flate and condition of the Romane Empire, as well as of all other Kingbomes, relieth upon two fperiall and princinall arounds, whereof, the one refpecteth Religion, and the frenice of Son, the other outward and humane pollicie, that is, the well ordering a quiving of the common wealth it-felle.

Couching Religion, and the feruice of God, I prap pe what a manner of thing was it in the Romaine Empire being Ita. lian and Abolatrous, that is, fo long as Rome was the mane fion place where the Emperours kept : it was wholly Ibo. . latrous, and more wood and furious in infinite fuperflitions, then

then any Mation of the world beude, (whatforner Dionifine, Halicarnaffeus, an Deathen, in his fecond Boke of Antiquis ties, both thinke and gine out to the contrary.) And even fo in the Papacie, there was, and is, (as after thall appeare) as aroffe and outragious Ibolatry, as euer was beard of. In both of them there were bled procedions , purging by San crifices, Dolp-water, Diaters, and Sacrifices for foules beparteb, and Canoles fer by in the worthip of the bead. -Concerning the gouernment or policie of the Moolatrous

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the centure of Juffin is confirmed : where-in, fpeaking a. gainft fome that were ignozant in the Greeke tongue, be teatheth this, that, Antichritt is not fo called, for that he should come before Christ, (whereupon they harped by mil-understanding the word,) but for that he should proue contrarie to Christ and his word : whereupon he is called Avrixersos, Antichrift: as if we floud fap, articapped Ta xeisa, oppolite to Chiff, the mojo bering Greeke, not & atine.

But it may feeme fraunge , that feeing be foonto become an abuerfarie unto the whole bobie of the Geripturer the was not rather tearmet avritteg, abuerfarie to Gob,og fome fuch like name, then derikerses oppolite to Chaift. But the reafon map bee this , that feeing Chuit appeared fathe latter ace of the world, and that his boctrine, (whereunto be chiefely oppofeth bimicii) was mabe manifelt, and was recriued in this faft time: It was meete, that he that foult oppofe himfeife in the fapo latter age and time, unto Chait and his boctrine, fould rather bee called and beferibed buto us buber the name of ar-Tixersos (Chiffes foe) then of avriders (Gobs foe) or avrevayyennor (Gofpels foe)or by any other name or title. The certaine it is , that this observation agreeth fitte with that of the Revel.cap 16.13.& 19 20. where the chiefe inffrument of this apollacie is called by a kinde of prerogative The falle Prophet : as if he, among all the falle prophets that ever mere, foulo be the moft Daungerous and bereflable. And acapne , the Beaft it felfe , under whole figure and fhape , the condition and manner of this Defection , is by the Suirit of Son reueffen into ba: is lavo to bee full of names of blafibe. mie, who bome, and buckennes, Reuel 17-3.4. the which in mine opinion, no man may fuffly make boubt, but that it is to be referred bato the name and bottrine of Antichift.

Therfore this place feemeth to require this at mine hands. that for the lietter unperCanbing of this pount , and the nie. ner moofe of mine affertion: I fould fpeake of, and handle the portrine of Antichill, and compare it briefly with the Borrine of the Golpell. And in this poput we thall the better moceede if me fhall beare in minbe thefe two things.

The first is, that this Antichift, of whom I fprake, is fuch a fellowe as affaulteth and overthoweth, not only one pornt of Chillian Doctrinc (as many Beretikes in time paft bib . as namely Simon Valentinus , Marcion, Nicholans, Cerdo, Manes Sabellius, Arrius, and fuch like:) but undermineth, corrupteth, and beffrapeth the whole frame of Chaiftes boctrine and example which marrife of his is bear aped buto by cuen in his bery name or title, as being inbefinitely, or without limita. tion, tearmen in euerp place where this matter is handleb. wirtximevoc, the opponent of oppofite perfon. Dther Deretikes are limited within the compatte of one or two errors of theirs as if any benie that Chill is come in the fielb.be is an Antichitt : but a Simonian Deretike. Hymenaus, and Philetus were in the vaics of Paule, accompted Deretikes: but that was in fome one certaine refpect, as namely, because they immugned the poput of the refurrection of the fleft: Thefe wic. heo men although they then believed and taught, per Paule is plaine that this Antichnit, of whom here we have fooken, was not pet come . Wilhereby it is cuibent, that this man is an onbe fellowe. Differing from the other fimule iberetikes. as being a more foule blafphemour then the tobole packe of them all.

The fecond is (which here I bo but propound and barely affirme purpofing afterward to make it plaine by fubftantial moofes) that this faping of Paule concerning the opposition. or contrarietie of the boctrine of Intichift to the Gofpell of Chrift , neither can or may be binberftoob or taken for the fect and religion of Mahumet, For although it be forthat the fame allo bee biffenting and repugnant to the bottrine of Chrift, pet neither both Mahumet himfelfe fit in the temple of Gob, neither bo they that profelle to bec of his feet, acknowledge themfelues to be Christians, or Bastours, or Brelates of the Chriftian Church, (the which both Antichnift himfelfe and big adverents bo) but do openly, and profestedly in boatting D 2

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mannengine io out, that they abandon both the name and companie of Childians.

Rowlet bs come to confiner of fome perticular poputs of the Dapill's bottrine (who not withflanding will needes be accomplete the only Chiffians and Catholikes of the world) and fee how truely the Spirit of Bob bath called it a bottrine oppolite and contrarie to Chiff and his word. For herein the auncient witters agree with be , in referring this fpeach of Paule bnto the Bouish Synagogue , that is , to that Church, which boafteth it felfe : but fallelp, unberthe glozious tiele of the true Church of Chuit . Bernard upon the Canticles, Hom. 33. They are the ministers of Christ (fapthise) but they ferne Antichrift . Hilarie agapuft Anxenius: Vnder the colour of preaching the Gospell, he shall be contrarie to Christ, in such fort as the Lord Iesus shall bee renounced, euen while men thinke he is preached. Laffly, Chrisostome upon Math. Hom. 49 . That wee may bee able (fapth he) to difcerne the doctrine of Antichrift fro that, that is true and fyncere : wee are willed to make our repayre to the holie Scriptures: for (fapth he) if wee respect outward names, titles, and professions, wee shall fee that they professe themselves to be Christians. And after that he abbeth: Yea, they will outwardly pretend greater chaflitie, and mortifying of the flesh, then shall appeare to be among the true Christians, The which we fee and acknow. leoge to tumpe very fiely with the profession of Poperie, and to paint the fame out buto ba in ber proper colours.

God, and when they will needes beare be in hand that their Waifer-rake , or cruft of bread made of Branne, is a berp true Gob. Secondly , they baue fet bu a number of Toolies, which they worthip, and appoynt men to monthin God by, and through them : and in this poput they themed their wonderfull ercelline outrage. And as touching our eternall faluation and the caufed thereofither, as though the worke thereof were not fully finified and perfected by the only facrifice of our Saufour . ba Davlie celebrate and thruft byon be the facrifice of the Walle for the remillion of finnes. En fomuch as that pereffable and borrible top of the Dopiff Balle, bath cleane befaceb and befeared the true and only meanes of our faluation : In fuch fort as men now a bacs reft not them-fetues open the onlie beath

I anfwere, that euen thereby it both much more appeare that they are the bery antichniffs of whome we heere intreate. For fo much the more beably foes they are unto Chrift, in that they take upon thein bis name and bodrine, and per quite and cleane ouerthrome the fame : euen as clofe theues, and ferret foes are ten times more permicious, then outward and knowne enemies.

It is more likely therfore (in mine opinion) that this

word Papa, commes from the Sicilian touque, which therein Agnifieth bignitie and great honour, as Suidas obserueth, laps ing, έτω δε γέγεται παρά Σιρακιυςίους ο πατλη, παπας, κολ κατά αναδιπλασμόν τέ π, σα ππας. A Father is called as mong the Syracufians Papas, and by boubling the letter, P. Pappas. And Homer wieth the berp faine word, Odyff. 6. lib. whereupo, the auncient Witter Didinus matteth thus, was-

πα, πεοφάνκοις φιλοφεονητικό νεωτές επός πρεσβυτεροι. Papa is a fawning word proceeding from a pongling buto bis elber. And this name was fometime given indifferently buto all Bifhops, as appeareth by the Epiffles of Sidonine Apollinaris, Gregorie the areat , and of others before their time, as namely, Cyprian, Ierome, and Auftin, in whose wife tings we fall commonly finde Bifbons, called Papa. Butin proceffe of time, by means of claw-backs, it was referred on-Ip for the Bilbop of Rome, as if he were the higheft and loade. farre of all the reft, that is, the only Billoy of all Billous. and to whom only true bonour belonget. As inveet at laft it came to palle after time that this opinion was once receiuch into the Church, that the Bilhoppe of Rome was the heat thereof, in whose power only consisted the right of disposing of preferments, and bifpenling with the keyes of the Church. and that all other Bithoppes had no further ftroake in mac. ters, then was allowed them by way of commission.

In fo much, that on his five the merogatines of the Romane Ben, were by the Emperour him-felfe proclaimed, and the Biffion bim-felfe blaved out with the title of Vniverfall Byfloop : the which, (to fay the truth) could not otherwise come to paffe, for that Antichaft muft neeves baue bin featen at Rome, and not at Conftantinople, as herreafter fhall be beilared. Laftip , Helmodius reporteth in his hiftorie of Saxonie, that Alexander the 3. would in no cafe acknowledge Fredericke to bee lawfully abmitted, and all because the poore Emperour helb the wrong ftirrope while his holineffe fouit mount on boyle-backe . But among other authors , it were amb to reade in this behalfe Bernardus, as well in his fecond bake to Engenius Bilhop of Rome, where in conclusion be breaketh out into thefe words. Thou haft more need (quoth be) to have a Rake in thine hand, than a Scepter to perfourme the office of a Prophet : As allo in his Epiffies, namely 230, where at laft fpeaking of the tyramie of the Biflop of Rome, he maketh an exclamation in this lost. At first indeed ye began to play the Lords but ouer the Clergie, contrarie to the counfaile of Peter: and within a while, 1. Pet. 5.3. contrarie to the adule of Paule (Peters fellow-Apoftle) 2. Cor.1.24. you will have dominion over the faith of all men. But ye stay nor there, ye haue taken vpon you more, namely, to haue a peremptorie power in religion it selfe. Now, what remaineth whereon ye might further incroach, except ye will go about to bring the very Aungels under your fublection, &c. Ethat can a man fap more then this, whereby me might conceine that any bib take byon him the power of God ? So that now no man can tully make boubt, but that the Romane Bifhon is the bead, and chief-taine in the king. bome of Antichrift : And that luch as imbrace and maintaine

his boctrine, are to be reputed and reckoned in the number of

Antichaiftes,

I. 2.8c & 4.3.) hathplainly anouther, that in the latter times men fould bepart from the faith, and fould imbrace and forcas abroad binellift boctrine . The which allo the berp worde of Apollacie (which wee haue before out of Paule saught, thoule happen inwerrhe kingbome of Antichieft both Sufficiently broute, Acapite, Austin lib. 23. De Cinitate Des, cap. 19 interpreteth o word ac Tor rade Age, For, the Church of God, and not In the Church of God : as if it were write ten He shall sit for the Temple; on in sead of the Church of God . But as for this kinde of fpeach be mighehaue been well prough acquainted with it, out of 1. Cor.6.19. and 1. Pet. 2.5. where wee fee that the Temple of God is taken for the people and place where God is worthinged : which by an other name is called the Church. Therefore Antichrift fhall fit in the Temple of Goo, that is , be fhall erereife that his power, among the bery faithfull and children of Gob. For

this defection was to fall out even in the mioft of the Church it felfe. In fomuch as they that were the authors and main. tapners of the fapo Apoliacie, fould not with flauding boat and vaunt themfelues under the name and glorious fiewe of the Church of God; and to make foot, they only for forth, will necbes bee tearmed and reputed for the true Church . And that they only are the true Piclates and Billiops of the fame. Wibereby efpecially appeareth that which I baue often inft. nuated, namely, that the Sectories of Mahumet are not the men of whom Paule fpake , and prophecied in this place: although the bottrine of Mahumet & of Boverie began much about a time. (For Mahumet, which was the falt of the two. began biber Heraclins : and the Dapifticall tygannie, began fomewhat before, under the Emperour Phocas. So that thefe two Kingtomes being fo oppolite, & repugnant to Chriftes, Differ not much about ten peares, touching the times of their feuerall beginnings.) But pet feeing the followers of Mahumer, be openly renounce the name of Chuftes Church, and will at no hand admit, much leffe pretend that title or calling:and feeing on the contrary five the Papifles, Do fo greebelie affect , holbe, and appropriate to themfelnes the file of the Church, the title of the Comple of God, and the name of Catholikes: there is none, if he would bee accompted of any right fungement, that can make any further boubt, who it is, of whom this place of Paule is to be buberitob, And this onis nion and interpretation of mine is holpen bereby, for that the perp feliole-men themfeluce bo flatip benie that Mahumet is the right Antichrift, or he whom Paule meant in this place. And accapite . Bernard . ouer and belives those things which be wrote unto Engenius Bilhop of Rome , and tuler at that time of the Popili Synagogue (wherein it calely appeareth, that he acknowledged the Sea of Rome to be the Seate of Antichia.) And as for that which Vignierns bringeth out of the Comments of his ichale-men,namely, that Antichtift flouin bee borne in Babylon and line in Iudea , in the Cities of Bethfaida and Corazin: It is bery fottifb, and is notto ber warranteb by any place of Scripture : but be,like a fubtile merchaunt, was bilbofed by that meanes to coprupt the true meaning of that place , and peruert the fence of the Scripture. that fo no man might once thinke of the Hope of Rome.

That Rome, which is in Italie, and is repayred out of the dust and ruines of the olde ouerthrowne Citie: is the feate or Chaire pointed at and painted out by God himfelfe for Antichrift that (hould come

At whereas Auffin writeth (lib. 20. De Cinitate Dei cap. 19.) that it is uncertaine, and not plainty armet in the Scripture,in which of the Churches of Bob Antichift fould fir, as, whether at Rome, m) at lerufalem , but only that it is generally fapo , that he thould not fit in the Cemple of Ibols , but fould rule in the rutoff of Bobs Church : this faying of Austin, I fap,is but feeble and is at no band to be veelbed unto . bonds are seamen Mountaines , whereon the woman fitterh. Wiberein Rome is most certainly and plainly beleighes red which at that time was Maiffrie of al the world, and was ennimanip called the * feauen-bild Citie , becaufeit contay: * Sepricollis. ned within the compaffe and circuit of her walles, feauen Dilles. In refpect whereof Virgill in the fecono booke of big Georg handling matters of bulbanbrie, writeth thus. This life the old Italians led: both Remus and his brother, And fo Etruria Waxed frong, by this meanes and no other: And fo did Rome arife at last, the branest towns of all, Which dothinglofe fearen fenerall hils in compasse of her wall.

A companie of the faithfull which ferne God fincerely ; and retaine among them the publike markes of their aboution which himlelfe bid inflitute, as the facred word, the Spacraments, and bifcivline : whereby it falleth out, that by thefe three notes , as being ber true and proper banges , the true Church of God both confift , is marked oue and feuered from the ertonious and falle Church, to wir, by the time wore thin of Boo, which is framed as himfelfe bath oppained in his balle more, (Ich. 10.25. My sheepe heare my voyce) by the fincere ble of the Sacraments, which Gob bimfelfe appopul ted : and laftly, by bue vifcipline dit correction of manners; I noke therefore what forfette and companie of menhane not thele marked among them ; I meane none of them at all sie cannot bee called the Church of God: but if it have but bue of those notes , then is it called a Church ; but only in formere. fuect. But looke what congregation retaineth moe of thefe marked, the fame map with better right be called a Church. than that which both fewer. Now, if we fhall make fearch after thele marlies in the frate of poperie , wee fall finoe, that the fame map be called a Church: but only in refpect, because it abterurch and retaineth but a very bead , and backe print of the former notes : namely , the ble and marke of one Sacrament, to wit, Baptifine: the which by the fpeciall pronivence of Cop, remapnes (couching the fubitance of it) uncorrupt, euen in the parkell time of iooperie : but touching the accibents of circumffances view in the abministration of it, it was altogether befilet , corrupt , and prophanet . Therefore the kingbome of Poperie and of Antichia is the Church of Bob but bevending as it were by one poor marke and a fie. Lie ffenber chread . thers, bellve the event or accompliftment of things, which ad I have faid is the fureft interpretour of this prophecie, The reason which I meane, is this, o fieing Antichailt was to fit (as I haue auouched)in the feate where the Romane Empire mas placed , it could not be cholen, but that the faid Empire muft firft be put out of place, and troaven biber fote , before the feate of Antichaift could there be erected, for to fuch a purnole he had neede to finde Rome emutie in as much, as while it was pollett by others, it could not pollibly be leaged upon by him. Againe, feeing all the kingbome of Antichift is nothing elfe but a plaine befection from the Golpell, that fo the world might iuftly be punifhed and plagued for their birthankefulnes and contempt of the word, it was requilite that fielt the true boatine foulb be preacheb , and the Gofpell fpread abroave, from which afterwards the bugratefull world might becline and fall amap. For except that those things had gone before, thefe other could not have followed, neither sould the Antichiffian hingbome be rightly tearmed an A-

But as for that time it is not per come: for although me fee the Empire of Rome great. ip emponerifhed, pet fo long as the race of the French Kings thall continue, to whome by right the title of the Empire both appertaine, the Romane bignitie thall not be biterly luppred. freing it fall be up-healt in her faib Kinger. Catherr-bnto in. beebe agreeth that laping of Impocentius the thirt, in a certaine Cuittle ofbis fent to the Bilbons of France : The aduauncement (faith the) of the kingdome of Fraunce, is the glorie of the Apostolike (that is Romish) Sea. Burus for this matter,let them that lift proue it, for Epromife pe for mp part, I gine but little credit to it, as haumg juff caufe to fut. fpect it, feeing it hath no ground or warrant : but contraville the thing it-felfe telleth another tale; For the Franch Rings. te is certaine, were the greatest fattourers and parpanes, for the rearing and bp-holoing of Inticheift bim-feife , and bis Antichailtian kingvorne, that could be, and efpecially that Chine Pipin, which was furnamen Short : and atteme, Lodos ticus Pius, his nephewe, who allo was the manthat at firth gaue buto this Antithiif all that ftreete, tearmed Via Flamiwas, (which alfo the Indiane call Intile Rome, and others S.Peters pervinionie:) and this for forth is that conget and conterfaite nonation of Conflantine the great, which the Popes Baraffres Do fo oft , but berie betruit, make fuch boaft of. And further, Lewes the eight, a Phillip Augustas, bit fheare by the fair kingomne of Aurichitt, with all the power they could make either of them-felues, or of their kingdomes, So

that this one fpeach and affertion is fufficient to thewe, that Auffin was heuer the author of that boke, feeing that in his time, neither were the Brench Kings fo famouffy knowne, neither was the Empire fultained by the French.men, which began long after in the bapes of the Emperour Valence. Row out of all thefe things which have bin fpoken, that is nathered, and concluded which I have affirmed, namely, that both the Golpell was fielt to be preached, and the Romane Empire to be beminifhed, befoge that the Ringbome of antiehriff could plainely be beferped or effablifbed. And touching this onerthrome of the Romane Empire, Paule hath inocede made fome fignification of it, but fome-what obscurely, and that be feemeth to have bone in two refpects : firft, for that be fpake unto Chriftiana, and thole that were notignozant of this propherie, and of this peece of worke afor they had heard the Apolities in their publike preachings in the Churches, often handling that matter, as it appeareth by their writings. Secondly , to the end that none fould thereby take vifpleafure : or that any baunger thould thereby growe buto the Church from the Romane Emperours , for that fome of the Chailtians thouth feeine to prognoficate, and bartily wilbe their beffruction, Bucalthough Paule habitterip concealed this point, pet it might fufficiently be unberftoobe out of Daniell the 2, and 7, that fuch a thing flouto come to paffe.

Det that place of John, 1, John, 2, feemeth to make a. cault both this mine affertion, and alfa this place of Paule, wherein John affirmeth, that in his papes Antichpiff was alreadie come. Some bente it flatip, And therefore Auflin, lib. 18. De Cinitate Des, Cap, 25, & F3. lant, that that time is altogether bibben, and unknowne, and is berie earnet berein, that neither the moneth, nor the peare, not the time of his comming, and ofhis kingbome, can be fearneb. But they that are of that opinion , fegme to be becritich; and berrein thep erre, for that thep unfkullfully, and fallely bonte tribittethole things buto one man (as I baue beclared) tohom they take thould be the only Antichitt, which are to be winer. flobe of the whole fate and bobie of Antichiff. But, that which the Scripture both in plentifull manner beliner touthing the kingcome of Antichailt, is to be taken of a whole bead-rowle of men, and of a long fuccettion of matters and times, Some therefore are of another tubgement, namely, that the time is expellely fer bowne and betermined, wherein the fait kingbome of Antichift thould begin : and pet enen beerein allo fome biffent from others. For fomerhinke that

the peare 1000, is the prefixed time, fome 500, others 400, after the birth of Chaift : but feing that all thefe, becaufe for their affertions they ground boon no certaine and birect place of the holie Scriptures, but reft only opon boubtfull coniectures of their owne framing, we will take an other, and that a more fure courfe, grounding our felues (except 3 be beceiueb) bpon a moje firme foundation. 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Mow the cause why they all flumble especially buon this fone, is, for that they bo not attentiuely marke the berie wordes of Iohn : and pet the Spirit of Bob in that place fneaketh berie fimblie and plainely. For after be had fore. tould the flate of Antichaift in the land 12. Chapter, and alfo Defcribed what manner of one he fould be : he alfo in plaine fort bib fet bowne the time, wherein all those things thould be fulfilled , namely, the yeare 666, which he tearmeth the number of a man, that is a plaine number, and caffe to be knowne, not hard to be reckoned, (enen as in Efay, Cap. 8.1. a writing that is plaine and eatle, is called the venne of a man,) and itt fuch fort to be commpted , as men blitally in thole papes were accustomed to number. Aud thefe peares beginne not at the time of Chriffes birth, but, rather of bis fuffering, and from the time of Iohn. Therefore the Spirit of Goo telleth be , that in the Supputation of thefe peares, we must ble the orbinarie, and common kinde of reckoning then practileb. And the realon why the Spirit of God is fo rarefull about souertiling be hereof, is, leaft when queftion is made of the comming of Antichnit, we hould thinke that those yeares were in fuch fort to be coumpted, as in Daniell Cap. 0.2 c. where the yeares of & huffes comming are reckus ned by weekes of yeares : for we should be beceived if we thould take that courfe. Eruth it is , that God would haue the time and comming, as of Chail , fo of Antichaift, erpreffelp fet bowne bato bs, but pet both of them after a biuers manner of reckoning. For the time of the comming of Chiff, was to be coumpted among the lewes by weekes of peares : but the time of the comming of Antichift, by a familiar, popular, and common kinde of numbing, fuch as all men bib ogbinarily bie. those 666, yeares are to be reckoned, both from the beath of Chriff, and from the time that this propherie was reueiled in : and efpecially for the more eafte and readie rechoning. let be beginne to reckon from the time of Chriftes fuffe. ring, fo in the 666. peare after his Paffion , that blafphe. mous kinabome of Antichaift, whereof the Spirit of Gob had fore-warned, had openly, and euerie-where feazed upon the Church of Gob. Doft certaine it is, that at that berie time, and in that berie peare, the Papifficall and erecrable Maffe , a berie befacing and blotting out of the beath of Chaift, began euerie-where prinately in Churches to be ce. lebjated in the Latin tongue , as Bale witeth in the firth of his Centuries, Cap. 80. namely, in the time of Vitalian Bifton of Rome.

Acaine, this number 666. limited for the reueiling of Antichtift, map feeme to fome to be fo fet by Bob, for that it containeth about the third part of thole two thouland peares, wherein fome thinke the world thall fland and continue, from the time of Chaift, buto the ende of the monto, only there is a little over-plus of yeares in this multiplication over and about the fuft number of 2000, and those are to be allowed to this ende and purpole, that Antichill might have a time wherein be fouto raigne , and after haue a fall. But couthing this which I have affirmed of the numbring of 666. peares : how true it is , let be now more attentiuelp confiber. For the iffue of things, and the accomplifment of the Bapophecie it felle,ought to be accoumpted an omni-fufficient witnelle and profe of mine affertion. The which , that it may the better appeare, this I fap, and affirme, that it is mod certame, and out of all controverfle, that the ftrongell bulmarke, or rather ground-worke of the Antichriftian king. bome, began then publikely, and in berie beebe tobe lapde, and to be reared by in the mibit of the Church, when one onelp man , by the publike confent of Chriffians, began to be called and acknowledged by the name of Bythop of Bythops, oz, Vniueriall Bylhop : and this began, and that by

the authoritie and will of the Emperour himfelfe, about the peare of our Lozd fire bunbzed and foure, as is manifelt out of Chonicles.

For Boniface the 2. Billion of Rome, was pronounced by the Emperour Phocas (as I have thewer before) univerlau Pope and Bifhop of all the world, and that with this prerogatiue, that this priniledge to him graunted, fould continue for euer to bis fucceffours being Bilbons of Rome and there feated . This was bone by Phocas in the first years of his raigne, which is reckoned by all Buftoriographers to bee the peare of our Lord 603. Meither bio Phocas beale thus libe. rally with the Romane Bilhou for nothing; for whereas the faid Phocas had billanoufly murbered his predeceffour Mauritius the Emperour : by this fo bountifull a bribe beftowed on the Romane Bilhops (who alwaies could be much in the Citie with the people of Rome) he redeemed, and fo recoues red the fauour of the people, by the helpe and commendation of the land Bilbon. For before the neaple of Rome bare bead. lie batred agaput this Phocas , for the butcherlie murther fo treacherouffp perfourmed by him boon Mauritius; and in remarbe thereof they would none of him for their Emperour. Therefore by the inbuffrie of this Boniface Bifboy , in way of recompence of to liberall a largis, Phocas was brought in fauour with the people of Rome: who thereupon began in folemne fort to crie, God faue the Emperour. It may peranuenture be fuppofed alfo, that Phocas was mouse hereunto. in regard of a conflicution of Iuftinian , (which is to be read. lib. 2. Wouella. 131.) concerning the foure holie Counfella. where the Emperour willeth the Bilhop of Rome to fit firth in the Spnod , and the Bilhop of Constantinople after bim in the fecond place. Row, touching this prindenge graunted by Phocas, it was afterward confirmed in a Sprion affemblen at Rome, buter the fapt Boniface the 3. Anno 607. as Sigifbertus affirmeth. The which Spnod confifted of three fcore and two Bifhops, thirtie Priefts, and the Deacons, where. in there was full power graunted to the Billoy of Rome , to ratifie

to quaile barlie more and more, or rather began now to bee euen at the laft caft in Italie: and lattly, when at Rome the iRo. mane Bilhous became the Emperours Legates or Wicegerents, or rather became carners for themfelnes, and began in their owne name, and as of their owne authoritie to meoble in Church and Common wealth matters , to bifpofe of pub. like and minate affavies . and by the confent of the people to rule the whole roall: then at last they eatilic intreated the Con-Rantinopolitan Emperours to veelb over buto them (and that by publike ebict , and unber a faire Charter) all that their intereft and inrifaction, which they had our the Romane Dis Chops: And further, that they would will and commanne, that wholocuer hereafter were by the people and Cleraic, elected Bilhous of Rome, flould forth-with, without any confirmation therof had from the Emperour, and mithout fending him a facred Builtle (as they tearmed it) whereby they protefted buto him their loyaltie; bee reputed for lawfult Bifhoppes of Rome, and bee by and by accompact to have all lawe in their owne hands not fubiect to b comptroutement or centure of a. up. Elthereby it came to palle, that now the Romane Billiops needed not the confirmation of any, no not the confent and auprobation of the Romane Emperour himfelfe (who then kent at Confrantinople) but even of their owne fminone, as being now become their owne men, tooke byon them that authoritie nomer and bignitie. Soo that from that time forward, the favo Bifhous began to line as men free from all turifoiction of the Emperour, that is, without the checke or reach of any man or Magiffrate whatforuer: pea they becan to bee compred like unto &DD himfelfe, not to bee inteced or cal-Let into suction by any mortall wight . (Canon . nemini, 17. quaft. 3. and Canon, Nemo, quaft. 3.) Dow this without boubt may feeme to bee the full beight of the Antichillian kingbome , and without ell controverfie it is to bee fo e. freemed . efpecially confidering that it was erected, came to light, and obtained to ample authoritie at fuch a time. And this fo great and oner-fpreading power of the Romanc Bilhop,

Bifhap, whereby he was erempted from all cenfure and inrifbircion of the Emppye, was graunteb firft buto him bp Conftantine Pogonatus the bearbed, an Emperour of Confrantinople, whole raigne is reckoned to be about o pere 666. Di as fome reckon 668, But pet Charles Sigonius (lib. 2, of the kingbome of Italie) hab rather referre the graunt of this prinilebge buto the peare 684. Dowfoeuer it be, certaine it is that Benedict Bilhop of Rome , was the firft that euer vico the benefite of this over-lathing and licentious libertie . And it is an calle matter for a Clearke or Scrinener to miffe in the compt of a peare or two : which is to bee refourmed by making recourse to the Revelation . For it is well knowne to all men , what great binerlitie is fometime found among the Diffortographers about the fupputation of yeares and times, and that by reason that the Christian Church bath not alwaies obferued one and the fame manner of reckoning. Therefore in fo great a fomme as this, it is like prough that a few baies thould either be abbed or betracted, Edibereby me fee it now appeareth, that the kingbome of Antichift was framed and fet up the very fame time and yeare that the fpirit of God had fore-tould:namely, Anno Domini 666. TEt there is one thing more , which as it map feeme, may be obiected unto that, that bath been fpoken, And that is Revelation 20.2. & 7. where it is written that after a thouland peares Sathan fould be let loofe, and fould trouble the whole world, and gather together Gog and Magog. That is, the Gentiles, aliaunts and fraungers from the Church of Goo, to make warre an apout her . Some therefore suppose , that by this place, rather, the time of the commfter and Aingbome of Antichiff is fer bowne and limiter. Burdow pariable and biners the interpretation and indgements of the duncient writers baue been toughing the fence and meaning afthat place , appeareth by Auftin lib. 20. De Cininos Dei cap 8.9. & lib. 21 .cap. 22. Det I will fpeake what I thinke, and which, after abuiled confideration had of all things, touching that place, I fuppole is to be betermined thereof, namely , that those thousand peares (as is enibent, malt manifeffly, even by the event) do not a whit concerne of fee our the time of the comming of Antichiff : but rather that they are to bee reckoned and accompted, after that the lapb number of peares of 666. were once expired. Elthereby it commeth to palle, that by fucceffion, in this fort, of times, we haue plainlie fet bowne unto be , what fhall fall out and bee perfourmed, almost to the ende of the world . If or before the fant thouland peeres were to take place, those things hould be accomplished which were fpoken of Cap, 16.12. namely, that Euphrates fould bee bied up, and a map opened for the Kings of the Caft to come and make mualion byon thole Territogies and Countries, which were before lubiert to the Ø. Romitte

Romith inrifdiction, Which furely is come to polle: for bn-Doubtedip those Kings of the Call, which paffed through Euphrates, being brico up, (that is, which gave them colie paf. face through the mioft of ber Channell) and furmifeb the Segniories,that belonged to the Romane Emppre, were the Turkes. Theretore it muft neebes bee that the Turkes Einprie, fould firft bee railed before those thouland yeares could be fulfilled . But if wee begin to commpt chofe peares from the time of Chriftes fuffring : then affuredly before the orithall of the Turkes (which is reckoned to be about the peare After Chuft one thoulandtwo hundjed) thole thouland veares will bee fullie expired, and fo the Apocalips, that is the maphecte of the Spirit of SDD, Chall fecme falle. The which but once to thinke , is extreame impietie. The 22, Chapter.

- Pocte popute being thus made plaine, wee are now to lap open the meanes and fleppes whereby Antichill mas creps bp by little and little, and whereby Sathan mas to finith and being to perfection this worke of his. And

And alchough the fame for the most part are alreable touched in that that moes before , pet Paule bath briefly expressed the fame . when in a morbe he tearmeth all this mifchieuous morke A myfterie . For thereby he floweth , that fo great a mickebneffe Gould bee martifeb and verfourmeb by Bathan. couertly, craftely, closely, and fubtilely, for by the word (avgigeor) A mytherie, no excellencie is theweb of that beuiliff and Anothericall bestring, but only the craft and becrine of the mork-mailter, and author of this kingbome, (who is that nine Dragon and Gerpent, who alfo is called the Deuill. Reuelation 20,2.) and pet fome take this wood Mysterium. in fuch fence , as though Paule has therein of purpole affec. ten to expresse the areat Anithefu, or contrarictie that is hermeene the bottrine of Chift and of Antichift. Chat as the facred Cofpell of CDD is invery many places of the Seripture called in way of praife and commendation A myfterie : Do Antichnift foult also tearme bie peftifent and namuable bottrine, by the very felle-fame name of A myficrie : whereby it might freme to carie the greater counters nance of holiacife and maieflic amonait men, and fo beethe mme plaufiblie receiueb . And certaine it is, Rouela, 17.5. that the Beaft which remelenteth Antichift foonloudt buon his most wicked Superflitions the name of A mysterie. And this majeffie and folemne title be pretenbeth to abbe crebite. wite his falle poctrine, and also to the cabe men should not make too narrow fearth into thefe mattere, and at last inbeed efvic them what they are . And truelic this firong kinde of belution, was because buto the Bapiftes (as many things elfe more) from the nery Deathen themfelues, who cloaked their Ceremonies of Bacchus , their abbominable Church-rites. and ercerable Church-robberies , bnver the name (asit were under a feemely paile) of A myfterie, leaft fuch filthic pollus tions foulb euen frinche before men. So alfo the propinane Chairiffices of the Gapbelle Ceres, and likewife those bawbie follownities wied in the worthinge of Pryapus , and those hannuctting Tunkettes which therein were caried about ann

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and ovenly fewed, (as Eufebius reporteth in his Booke De preparat. Enangel.) mere fet out by the Pagans , with the plaufible title of a Amyfterie : Asthough they were no befileb thinges , but mpflicall , hibben , barke, and (in a wonde) berie benerable by meanes of their profound figniff. cations.

And (truft me)it was tuft fo in the time of Hoperie. (The thing it felfe and long experience bath prooued it to bee most manifeft and true.) for, under what title and colour bid they more commend and couer their Boolatries , Superftitions Ceremonies, yea and apparant blafphennies': but only bereby in tearming them Mysteries , Secrets, unberstood but of fem.and which were not to be publiffed or made knowne. So.all the malking attire of their Bifpops at their firft con. fecration , and after at their inflalling, being alreadic confecrate. So all the Stage-like furniture and implements at the celebration of their blafuhemous Maffe : So their Dabites in Monkerie, and to make font, an infinite companie of horrible blafphemies, and wicked actions of theirs, are borne and boatteb out as facred and holie , because (forfooth) they are folenme and mylicall in their lignifications: where. as notwithftanbing , in bery trueth they contayne nothing elfe then meere coniurings agaynit Goo himfelfe, and plaine blafthemies agaynft the bloub of Chift.

Cherefore, the meanes whereby this kingbome and impiette is eftablifeb, is, and ever was, craftie cousoning, and beceipt, and that under the goodlie precence of godlinelle and of bolie mpfteries : intrapping by that meanes the fimpler forte, who were not able to tubace of the matter by the rule of Gods word.

Could obtaine his purpofe. But before we open the fame anie further, or teach more at large the truth thereof. (3 means the fate of Doperie) may herein refemble her * platfourme, and agree iompe there-with, in hauing her tenne laft Dones berie fhort liu'd, for a finall conclusion, and ruinous confusion of that kingboine.

Therefore both the number of the Rings which is fpecified in the Sermeures , and the berie fhort time of their couern. ment, confirmeth my interpretation, and proueth it to be moft true : which 3 hab rather follow, then that exposition which Primafius mineth of this place, binberffanding by an boure any time, whatfoeuer, either those or long, where-unto, the S. Wich being fo, we are now to lay open, by what fleppes this feate and typannie of the Romane Empire,ftept bp to fuch a tipe and magnificence, and how at last it attained his anall furniture and perfection of building, in

the place of * befolation, that is, where the Harma. theards and alibes of ruinous Rome were to be found. The first and originall ground-workes in laying and establishing the kingbome of Antichnift, were three, to weete, the errours of Derecikes, the contentions of Billiops, and the functities one benetions, and etcellite liberalities of Chillian Britis ces : for fo, that, their folifb and immoberate largiffe befto. med buon the Church is rather to be tearmed; then true beuo. tions : for they were too-too over-lafthing and cockering, fanouvers towards the Church, and thiefely, the Church of Rome . And touching thefe three caufes , which I called ground-works, of the Antichtiffian kingbonte, ic may ealifp be perceiued, that they like wife were three mightie and effectuall fleps or begrees, whereby Antichrift by little and little reared him-felfe bitto that huge, and tpraunous power which afterwards be attained.

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And fiell touthing ervours in matters of faith and relierion. truth it is, that the Romane Church, pea, all the Miefterne Churches remained more pure and found then the Cafterne. and thole in Syria, by two efpeciall meanes, the one, for that in the Weaft there were continuall perfecutions ffirred bo by the Emperours of Rome, the other, for that the wits of the Meternemen were alwayes more groffe and bull, where. by it came to palle, that they of the Cafterne Churches repapies often, in matters of boubt, buto the Church of Rome. and required their inderment and belpe, in condemning newfprong Derelies, and fo by this meanes, the credit and effimation of the Bilhop of Rome, began more and more in monperfull fort to increafe, and be biably reputed of in the Church of God ; for the many and biuers. Dereues that then were. bib not only fake the Chuftian faith, but mabe it as a matter greatly boubted of, among many, in the Caft cfpecial. lie , where-by alfo they mabe readie may for that generall back.fliving which after infueb. Ant therefore thole Derefles are called by Christitome, Armies of Antichrift, efpe. rially furh, as fprang laft, whereby, bitter contention mas rapfeb , and bealb , repugnaunt to the word of Bob. touthing the natures of Chailt, and of their bnion og lincking together , of the office of Chrift , and of the merits of our morkes, fuche as those were which were fitred bu by Arrins, Nestorius, Entyches, and Pelagius : which iberefes were both molt veteltable, and moft forceible, to ouerthrowe the uprightnelle of mens tudgements . And therefore by this meanes , byon a fubbaine, the fuperflition of Mahumetifme, began in the Call , and by occation of the continuall biffentions that were among the Christians, touthing fuch points of Doctrine, it was abmitteb willinglie, and premailed greatlie. For the Cafterne Churches inere now cainted curmoffed and foulie Deformet, with an infinite number of herelies : for looke how many herelies there are about matters of faith, and podrine, fo many foule blots and blemifpes there are in the Christian Churches. And trucly, Chryfoftome Chryfolt bpon Math Hom 49 oblerdeth verp welthat after fuch time as Theodofius o areat, hab once arounted temples; and places of publike affemblies even buto beretikes, it came: to palle that the Churches receined great beformitie, & wom. Derfull increafe of herelies. Cherfore the Churches of & Call fering they had loft all credit and remitation of @buffian page feffion among their neighbours @ countrepunen at house, then intreated Symmachus, then Billiet of Rome thathe month by his centure cobemne the hereties of Acatius, feeing that as then the Callerne Bilbops bab no fuch power & authoritie o. uer their people; fo alfo they believe of Agaberus ville moulb benole Antimus Bill, of Conft antinople sais on heretike. And to make fort, att Occietiafticall biftories are prenetfull in fuch: grammles. This therefore was the first meaner, inhereby the kingbom of Antich, began to get foting. The feroo meanes bereof was the continuali biffentions, garboiles, brawles, & wofull contentions of the Bilhops among the felues, whereby, not only the felues became obtous among mer, but even the boaring of Chill, wherof they were the villers, beaf to grow into btter cotempt. Thefe flurs were bery comon in the Cafferne Churches, but not fo bfuall in the Wieft, by meanes of the continual perfecutions that mere there: for inlenes a long reff, both make me more wanton & biffolute, whereby it came to naffe, b the Biffions that mere thus moleffeb mere glab & faine to flie buto an other Bill, of greater coutenance inherby they might be ealed, & kept fed wongful bealings offered the bo other Bilhons. Bom as for the Bill, of Rome, he no boubt by meanes of the famouines of the City it felfe, feemeb the most mincipal, who also was ready a willing to verly his helping hand in the redielle of other Bifhops their billreffet etrates: for both Athanafius being put out of his Bithonpricke by the Arrians, made his renaire to the B. of Rome, as buto a fure refuce : a after him Fabianus, a before him many other bio o like as anucareth by hillories, infinite it mere to reckon by all example in this behalf, in formuch as in procede of time this repaire buto the Romane Bilbons in times of erigence. Bracurco bim great authoritie among all nations in Christen-79 2 Doine :

bome : and that inbette fo great, as that the faid Billions bid there-by eatity take occation to abufe it. Zahere-buon . Bernard Lib. 1. & 4. de confiderat, ad Eugenium, complaineth creiuoufly that the Bilboy of Rome beffirres bin-felfe fo, as inheretin he fremen that he had inhere all fullneile of nawer, but int of inflice; when once it beman to be juffifed by A. polfolikeanthonine, that monfrous men, where probigious beatte thoulo be abmitted bato Bifhapzicke, and bigb Eccle-Rafticall preferments. This therefore mas the fecond beares whereby the Antiebriffian kingbome was abuaunced . The thirb a laft, was the excelline & coping fauours, that certaine Brinced. & efvecially Emperours bare to that Sca : for this third point mas likewife a wincipall viller in that building. for in those paper nat mily all men of all forts contended to their utmaft. euenlike man men, to labe thofe Bifbous with immoberate mealth and poffeffiong : but euen Emperours them-felues beaped upon them bonours, printledges, and other bignities belanging to the maiellie pfun Carperour. ot the office of a civill Magistrate, in fo much, as they submitteb buto the centure and approbation of the Bilbop of Rome, both their owne Derrees, and the Conftitutions of the Spnong . Inftinian the Emperour fent Ambaffabours buto Iohn Bilbap of Rome, to procure his apprebation of the bake of Citill Lames, which be ban mabe, and publifbed, as appeareth bpithe Coutte profited beforethe fair Coade of Iuftinian, Des, fome Emperours haue ouer fubmiffie giuen it out thus, that, Their Lawes do not discaine in waie of imitation, to refemble the holio Canons, as though (forforth) the majeffic and auchmition of elimperial elipies, mere farre infiriour unto that of the paopes Derrees and Canons. Thirdly, the bountifull beneutes of certaine Bifhonnes of Rome beftowed boon all fralie in generall , and more perticularly and specially upon Rome it felfe , as tellimonics of their loue . and plebges of their care which they had of their Citizens and Geepe, for Leo the firft, Bilhop of Rome, went out and met Artilas, who was making innafion boon Italie, and turned bim backe, bauing pacified bim with a very milbe french . in fo much as that furious Beaft (at whofe berie name al men trembled) being foothed by without once touch. ting any part of Pealis returned into Pannonia . Pelagius the tirth Billion likewife of Rome, bit fo aff wage Totilas, a molt renell twante . by humble fuite and petition, as that when he hab alreadic furpited Rome , and in great rage was beuifing hate to bring it to beter raine; per he obtapned thus much of this anorte and furious Totilas , that cuen Totilas himfelfe Bould inhibite further fierings and flaughter to bee committed in Rome . There are other great good turnes recorded of other Bilhous of Rome, employed either byon all Icalie, as by fending of interraying Ambaffabours : or els perticularlie boon Rome it felfe : which things, worthelie procured to them and their fucceffours, great and fpecialifauour, not only at the bands of talians and Romanes, but alfo of firangers and men of fortaigne Pations . Zabereby it came to paffe. that for remedie agapuft the injuries offered of fome officers. and Licutenants , pea fuch as were without the precincts of Italie; appeales were mabe buto the Bilbops of Rome. So Did Victor Bilhoppe of Fanfienna, call for affiffance at the hands of Gregorie the first, Bulbonne of Rome, against the Bubges in offricke, which:committed many things with wrong and bielener. So ikewife betooke into his protection Ifidore Muitellus , and Conftantius, agaynft the bard prorecoings of their Bithops. And in like forte be preibed bis helping hand buto Adrian Biffiop of Theber, agaputt Lavillfæus a the Detrapolitanes of infimiana(spift 46 imphot, 113)

So allo bib the faibe Gregorie mite berie fharply buto Brunchildathe Queene of Fraunce for that fie bib mickenlie permit the fewes within ber Dominions, to intertapne and keepe Chriftians as their band-flaues, and to conclude, thence it came to paffe, that berie barbarous people, and the Princes of Gorland (although as pet thep were aliaunts and Araungers from the profettion of Chriftianitie)hab the Bil. hoppes of Rome in berp areat accounnt, and indenoured to increafe and fet out their creditte and effimation to theif btmoft . For Atalaricus Ring of the Gothes , caufen by publike edict and proclamation, that Boniface the fourth, and Iohn. Bilhoppes of Rome, thould bee highly reverenced and worthipped by the prople and Senate of Rome. And after him Theodoricus , a fing tikewife of Goreland , commaunded the fame to bee perfontmed . To make foot, that I might herein compaise and four by all things as neere ad I can the principall viller of this authoritic and tyraunous power , was founded byon that famous faying of Chiff, fu much toft and boatted of , but mif-bnberftood , Feede my ficepe. Iohn 21. 16.17. The which the Biffiops of Rome concending with toth and naple, will needes have to bee unberftobe of Peter and bis fucceffours only, and in no cafe of Paule og of Iohn , who was mott beloued of Chaift, og of their fuccestours, affirming that they are the true and proper fucceffours of Peter, buto whom alone this power both anpercaine . Miberebpon it began that Peter was tearmed the Drince of Apolles , and the Bilhopps of Rome (which boall themfelues to be his fucceffours) make challenge of this mis nileoge, as tiev fo ftraight buto this feate & Citie of Rome, as loke wholsever thall bee thereunto inftalled, are without all controverfie indued with the like nower. But what faith Bernard buto Eugenius Bilhoppe of Rome, touching this matter ' Epift. 237. Surely in great bifbaine he writeth thus. A true successour of Paule, will say with Paule, not as being Lords ouer your faith, but furtherers of your joy. And he that is an heire of Peter, will give care vnto Peter, focaking

speaking thus, nor as bearing rule ouer the Cleargie, but as patternes vito your shock. Who will performe this vito me, that I may see before I dye the Church of God as it was in older time, when the Aposites let down et heir nets, not to catch silver or golde: but to catch soldes? Eather than the aposites let repute the street of performed the sea were to the reputer of the time and absolut since singuished for sea were to the reputer of true and labsolut since singuished processing, segrets, and supporters, whether the singuished processing, segrets, and supporters, whether the singuished sold singuished and as some singuished and as some singuished and as some singuished.

That the authoritie and power of Antic'rift was at no time received, without the refiftance, and gain-faying of fome good Billiops.

The 26 Chapter.

Do pet this power and Empyre neither came to perfection at loft , neither was blurned at firft without the great grutching and relitance of manie. Fog at all times, pea after the Apollacie was once begun, there were guer one or other, either good men, or Bifhonues, which openly gain laybit, and conbemnebit as wicked, oppoling alfo theinfelnes agaynt it franklic, and to their bemoft indeuour, by whose meanes the Loro bid sufficiently fore-warne bis Church, if it could bee wife to beware of this pake of bondage. And truely in the peare 600. what time as pet it was in the fmadling cloutes and beginnings; all the Greeke Churches, and efpecially that of Conffantinople, and which was bifperfed ouer Dacia, a Illiricum, or Slawonia . Amb Routly and cried out anaunt that blurved nower. Thole Bilhonnes which accused Symmachus, Bilhonne of Rome, before Theodoricus King of the Gother, among a. ther crimes which they lavo to his charge this was the principall,

What focurr thou halt loofe, &c. Agayne, forme of the chiefe and beft learned Bifhoppes of Germanie and Fraunce , (as appeareth out of the florie of Aventine in his Epittle to Analtalius) refiftet both the beginnings and goings forward of that hingbome. Chercfore wer fre tharmall ages there were Come which openty , even in the affemblies of Spriobs , cryes out anaunif this blurnes poiner : imtill at lall (ag was for toulinby the Spritt of Gob) Intichtift aut his boctrine prevailed and bare rule, (for lo it pleafed One to revence the contempt of his worde) while in the meane time every man helb bis peder Jano Cubmintet himfelfe thereunto in molt milerable and fauimmanner : which continuen to the toonverfull great burr of bil Ohiftenbome, butill fuch time ag John Wickliefe wagraplet , and ftirred up by God in England , who opposed binifile manfally agapnit it , and mas the first man that with areas valour cut the very finnemes of it a fumber . After whom , by the great goodnelle of BDD, John Hulle and lerom of Prage, were giuen be the verie two Dlive baunches fooken of Revelation 1 14 4. After them fucceeven Luther : and after bun John Catuin , and others , baliant and couragious Souldiers armed with the Spirit of & DD . who with great courage fet themselves agapust this poetrine and typannie : the which. reason it leffe perfmaneth no leffe, and the authoritie of holie Scripeures, which are of senerend , and lacres ellimation a: mond be both convince tt . With reason (3 lap) it ftanbeth; for that the kingpome of Chill and of Antichill cannot fland together, (for they are things repugnant and cleane contrarie one to an other and feeing that GDD hath made mo. mile that the kingbome of Chift Bould bee bath fere, and laft for euer, it muft neebes bee that the kingbome of antichrift, which binbereth the fame, thould bee taken away. For otherwife it could neuer come to palle that Chill fould freely beare rule ouer all. And, that a perpetuali and euerla. fling kingbome is promiled bnto Chrift; thefe places prooue. Pfalme 2.8. Daniell 7. 14.27. & 2.44. Luke 1.33. Mow, this univerfall pefection whereof I baue fpoken , is reckoned among the chiefe and principall enemies of Chiff and his king bome, which he at the laft thould fubbue. 1 .Cor. 17.25. Ediberefore it muft needes bee that the fame thouth be in the ende ouercome , and tratten baber frete . And touching the facreb authoritie of botte Beriptunde, this is moft plaine and euibent, that the moft auncient Mouheries of the Lords Wrowhere . have beate won this popht, that the kingbome of Antichiff foulb bee puerthowne . Dan. 7. 27. Reuelation 10.30. And laftly, buder the type and figure of that renow. nen and famous Antiochas ; (whoth fet out buto bs , to remelent Antichilft) the fame uniner is lave open unto ba. Dan, 8,23,24, and in the berfestellebilier.

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Therefore let be comfore the felues and be of good hope, aub let be fand fliffe in this our frife, for the reconerie of Einfles hingrome in as much as from the Lordes come mouth wee are affuret , that actiff the trueth of the Golpell thall penale, Chiff fall met the biccone, and the king bame of Antichift bee cleant thoylen . Crueth it is , that it leaneth boon many Supporters , and to maintanned with great force , and it feemeth a matterof infinite labour , bifficul. tie and bouter so bring to think the Romane route. But who can telle the will and perter of & D ? Witho can let. let, that it bee not erecuted 's Sieing there are fo many plaine monhecies of the ouerthrowe of this kingbome . Therefore we are not only to conceive hope that it hall fo come to paffe, out of that generall rule fet bowne, Efay 60, 12, Euery nation and kingdome that will not ferue me, shall be defiroved : but much more are we there-in to be firengthened out of this perticular prophecie of Paule, fet bowne of purnofe in this place.

But withall, out of this berie place, the boating breame of the Manichies is confuted, wherein they affirmed that that originall power , which as theck-mate, is oppolite in all things bnto the true Gob, and to Chail thould be of an euer-

laftine continuance.

In the fecond place we are to confider by what meanes this fo mightie and large a kingcome of Antichnift, fhall at laft be bilanulled : Paule aunswereth , that it thall be bone by the breath of the Lords mouth. Therefore it muft needes come to palle, that the fame thall be brought to nought after an o. ther fort then men thinke , or then other kingbomes be onerthrowne, If or by this manner of freach, or circum-feription, Paule fetteth out the word of Gob topned with the true fence and power thereof. And the reasons that may be veilbed of this fo ftrange a lubgement, map be biuers : as firft, that feeing the kingbome of Antichaill (which is a meere back-flibing from the Chailtian faith) bib at firft arife, and mag afterward by-heald by difginfing and bepraving of the word of God : fo by the faithfull and lincere publifhing of the fame, it thould be brought to ruine, Againe, fering that this fate and condition of things is a kingbome of parknelle and ignorance, it must neeves fall by the light and knowledge of the word of God. and by percue of the truth thereof, when once it begins to thine, for as by the riling of the Sunne, barkneffe is bifpelled, and by the bawning of the bay, the night panifeeth ; fo. the bricht beames of the Gofvell breaking forth , the kingbome and bodrine of Antichailt mult needes be beferieb, and wholie Dellropes, Lattly, Daniell 2. 44, & 7. 27. & 11,45. maketb maketh no mention of any other kinebonie, which thould be raifen after the preathing of the Gofpett. for Daniell fpeaketh but of foure Monarchies, after which is promifed a king. nome of Spainete & halv ones, which thould continue for ever: and fo hath he made knowne buto be, what fall be the flate of the world, even wato the latter pap : but the Swirit of God mentioneth not any other Monarchie which Chault fuccepe, and fupplant Antichzift and his kingbome : therefore it mult needes be, that this laft euen the Monarchie of Chuft, foult laft for euer. And touching the kingbome of Chaift, it confitteth and workerh mightelp by the preaching of the word of Goo : therefore by thefe weapons, and by this meanes, the kingbome of Antichrift is by Chrift to be ouerthrowne. And as heere the more of Bobis called the breath of the Lords mouth, fo in Efay 4. 1.1, by the fpirit of his lips, is meant the word of God working effectually , because the bare found of the word, without the fpirit of God, is finnly, and of it-felfe, of no force : therefore , whatfoeuer gworis wought in be by the preaching of the word, its to be afcribed wholie bnto God elone. How, the realon why there thall not follow a tilt Wo. narchie after the fourth this (in my opinion) can not to tullip be alleanered, which not with anning fome make accoumpt of as of a perp found one namely because in this latter, and lanquilbing ould age of the world, there can no fuch might and force of mankinbe be railed bp, as may be thought mere for the effablifing of a Monarchy. For buto the erecting of the fame great polute, were requilite, and great pollicie for the comming thereof : both which are now mauring to the world, it being become fo aged and croken an outo man as it is : for it is now in his becaien effate, all fortes of his nature being almost frent othis is theitreafon, Colhercunto to make aunfinere this I bemaund; can not Gob as caffip nom taple bp men as trong in bobie, and as politikein wir, as before be bath done, when he let up the former Monarchies . Far what is the reason why he can not bo the like if he lifted, being in bimfeltebe is omnipotem premaines alwaies unchangeable

and like himfelfe imhat then is the flav or impeding thereof forforth because it flands with the Lords pleasure to have this bittorie atcheiued by the only power of his word, and preas thing of the Bolvell, to the ende that fo he might the better commend his faid bodrine to be, in thewing buto be the infinite minht and maieftie of the fame , the which not withfan. bine men commonly neatest and fet light by. This mine onis nion is confirmed by that in the Reuel. 19.21. inhere the Antrell of Goo themeth, that the falle prophet/the Brince of this Damnable creme) and his abherents, thould be flaine with the from of the Lords above mouth. Now feeing we cannot conceive how this may be perfourmed by the power of the word preached, but only by outward weapons, as Swords, and futhe like: it feemeth in some

fort to be contrarie and repugnant unto this affertion of Paule. Dow then ' furely it is enivent unto all , that that place both not at all appertaine buto that Beaft, that reprefenteth Antichift unto be , but to that Beaft which bib pur: traite out bato be the Romane Empire , fuch as it was while it remained in Italie, which, that it Chault be ouerchrowne in Italie, by tenne Mings, is bere made knowne. And this expolition agreeth berie truly with the euent and bis frozie of things bone, from whence, we are eiperially to fetch this accomplifbment and interpretation of this prophecie. Cor if me no refnet who they were, who inbeche were the chiefe authors of the btter ouerthrome of the Romane Em. pire in Italie, boubcleffe they mere thofe Kings being tenne in number, whome tohn beere fpecifieth : although they bid not lineally or immerially fucceeve eache other in their feuerall races, yet they all, and enerie one of them both made inuas fion, and bare rule in Imlie. Df thefe, Rhadagafius was the first , who being mabe King of Gothes, Anno Domini 409. mane affult boon Italie, in the time of Honorius the Comperour, with 200000, Gothes, but with ill fucceffe. For being put to foile by Stillson (thiefe Captaine under Honorius,) and taken at the Citie Feffale, he was by him bandeb. Therefore this Rhadagafius , is not rechonen among thofe tenne Bings, which railed the bignitie of the Romane Empire in Italie , fixing that his inuaffon Dib no burt either to Italie itfelfe, or to the Empire of Rome, ercept onto heerein . in atuing apme as it were by his crample, and to opening a wap and pallage to others to follow him into Italie, caue them encouragement bentrouffp to binbertake the enterprife. Chefe therefore that follow, are the Kings that are mentioned in the Reuelation.

This now is the third of those tenne Kings, which bp the necree, and beterminate counfell of God, burned with fire that betettable Barlot, Eruth it is, that Attila lineb alfo about thefe times, who likewife perfournich great exploits, and greatly afflicted the Romane Empire. But this be bid in the Proninces, and not in Italie it-felfe. If or when in the fecond peare of Martianus the Emperour, be was befirous to innabe Italie, and having taken Aguilea, feemed to fet forward towards Rome : Leo, the first, Bilhop of Rome, and part of the Romane Senate, went out to meete bum on the way, and being come buto bim , bumbly intreaced bin to fuare the Citie of Rome : by whole petitions, fie was fa moued as that be theropon caufed his army to returne into Pannonia, not marching one fote further within the boundes of Imlie. Therefore this Attila is not to be accommpted among thole tenne Kings, which beugured the fielh of the Beaff, that is of the Romaine Empire, and walted the Citie it-felle with

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with fire.

4. Odoacer, is next, being in number the fourth of thole teine, and lived in the papes of Leo, the firft, Emperour. This Odoacer was of Campania, and entring boon Rome. called bim-lelfe at firtt, King, not Emperour of Imlie. De bio fleane cut off the race of all the Italian Emperours. De made bauock of Rome by the space of r4, yeares, in fo-much, as after Augustulus, which was suboued by him, there was neiter any called an Italian Emperour.

5. Theodoricus, King of Gothes, being lent for into Imile by Zeno the Emperour, to affift him against Odoacer, beib him-fetfe the Romane Empire in Imlie, bp the fpace of fifrie peares : and to the enve be might make it knowne, how little be eftermet Rome; be kent bis Emperiall refibence at Ra-

venna. This man was the fift,

6. Athalaricus, who fuccered his Father Theodoricus , under Anaftafius the Emperoure. For nowe the Empire of the Gother beganne by a continuali fucceffion of their Kings, to take roting and foting in Italie. And unber the government of this Athalaricus, the Gothes continued their Defacing of the bignity of the Romane Empire in Italia. 7. Theodatus, was the feauenth, and he alfo was a Goriff.

8. Viriges, the eight, King likewife of Gotland, after Theodatus, who waffed and fpotled almoft all Imlie. This mantherefore (ad Sabellicus reumsteth) utterlo pelacet, and mue out all the lames, ruftomes, pluilenges, tecolor of Anthuities of auncient families of the auncient Romares, which be found remaining in Italie. De lived unber the raigne of Juftine the firt.

9. Totilas Kim of Gother, fucceben Vitiges, and this is f minth of thofe to, Bings, De lineb unber luftinian the firft, Emperour of Conftarmople. This man both beliegen, facket, and bttetly baled the Citie of Rome and to conclude, quen as Denieit of God had fore-fhe wed it foulb come to walle. be burnt it with fire : and this fire raungen, a raged by p fpace of 40 baies, without realing, in fo much as the Eitie, being then fo throughly confumed, might juffly be induced to be that Geddon-Harma (the ruine of Rome) fpoken of in the Revel. that is the only threads & thearts, & breer ouerthrow of that famous & auncient Citie. for afrerebis vaftation.it remainen only a ruinous & befolate place. Int this befell in the yeare of our Lord \$46. This fromme continued as is fore-fbemed. Renel. Cap. 12,5, by the fpace of 42, moncthe, that is, three yeares and a halfe, for when the third years was expired, after this burning and beter ouerthrow of Rome bone by Totilas Belifarius, thiefe Captaine baber luftinian , began firth to renewe the fame, gathering together fuch frrang and frage menta thereof as were left; and at laft, to enuiron mich a mail the plot or foile where once the outo Rome flone, which is the berie fame, where-with even at this pay that part which thep call outo Romeris beautifico.

This man breing taken prifoner by Belifarius, was carieb bnto Conffantinople .. -

Daw touching thefe matters , if we begin to reckon the time from Alaricus, they were archieuen within the compaffe of about 1,22, yeares ; but if we begin , as others will rather haue it, at the time of Odoacer , they were 60, peares, and Some-what more in boing.

But, When as thep that are enemies to religion. thall have offered belief full occasions of marre as, if either the Bapille, or Curkes thall breake truce. and biolate the conditions of publike peare; then it falleth out that the befence and maintenaunce of Chriftian religion . ig towned with the quarrell of publike right and juffice, and for inforceb againff the Dapills, or Curkes, beine aliaunts, and Graungers from the profeffion of Chrift, and Chriftianitie: but not in this respect for that thep biffer from be in tellmion but for that they are perturbers and breakers of the publike quiet . The which conditions , feeing Lieinius was the firtt that brake, when appent express covenaunt, be fell to perfecuting the Chriftians : wee caunot make poubt, but that byon bery fuft occasion, marre was waged agaynt him . For among thole conditions this was a principall onerthat of Christians miche freely make profettion of their religion, throughout the whole Empyreof Romerthat their meetings (bould be approued as Jambull affemblies cano that neither Confiantine nor Licinius himfelfe fouln fiere bp perfecution agaputt the Chai-Rians, in regard of their faith in Chaift . Seeing therefore. that this first aun thiefe pappe of their league and common aarcement, was afterward ereacheroullie piolated and broken by Licinius; Conflantine his milly and byon good ground moue marre agoynt bitt , but not as being an Goolatrous King was so the ente to redieffe his error which he heato of Elnie: butco the ende that thole publike couenaunts . and knowne lawer of the Emppie, and verticular conditions a. areed byon be cocene them , Chould bee kept in face, being it mag not lawfull fa) either Df abem to biolate the fame . piroly, and lattly, that which out of the former bilcourfe is to be gathered, is this, that bore-after there remaineth no other Monarchie to be ercaed in the morto, after time that of Rome , and this Image thereof. (that is the Romane Antichailt) is becaped : and fo me map fer, that what-fo-ener was to come and fall out, from the firth beginning of Ponarchies, unto the ende of the world, was mabe knowne before-hand unto Daniell, Cap. 11. Theres fore upon the enbe and accomplishment of those things which are fpoken of in that Chapter, immediatly, the lait refurrection is not only mentioned, but alfo theeftate and condition thereof, to the great comfort of the godly, is beferibed, Cap. 12. And pet fould not the faithfull in regard bereof be the more flack in affaulting the kingbome of Antichift, as though their labour fould be fruffrate, and to no purpole, May affitredly, their indeauours thall take goo fucceffe, and by little, and little, they fhall caft bowne that, which God would not baue to fall at a moment, or without one blow. Therfore thep that bo either fincerely pacach, or faithfully embrace the Bofpell, bo baply grinde, walte, knap off, and to be fort, they almapes biminifhe fome-what of the Antichailtian kingbome, But againft this our third and laft collection, that feemeth to be obiected which is in Daniell Cap. 11. verf. 40, and thole that follow, which are thefe. 40. And at the ende of time shall the King of the South

push at him, and the King of the North shall come against him like a whirle-winde; with Chariots, and with horfe-men, and with many Ships : and he shall enter into the Countries, and shall ouer-flowe, and paffe

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paffe through.

41. He final enter also into the pleasant land, and many countries shall be ouerthrowen but these shall escape out of his hands, Edom, and Monb, and the chief of the children of Janus.

42. He shall stretch forth his hand also vppon the countries, and the land of Leipt shall not cleape.

43. But he shall have power over the treasures of Gold and Stuer, and over all precious things of Egpp, and of the Lybians, and of the Black-Moores, where hee shall passe,

44. But the tidings out of the East, and the North shall trouble him : therefore hee shall go foorth with great

wrath, to destroy and roote out manie.

4c. And hee shall plant the tabernacles of his palace betweene the Seas, in the glorious and holie mountaine: ver hee shal come to his ende, and none shal helpe him. Chis place of Daniell,if any other be, is boubtles, berie intricate and obscure. Wherby it bath happened, that the inoge. ments of expolitours , baue bin bilerepant and biuers among them-felues. For fome ernounde it fo as that they refer it buto Tigrenes and Mithridatis who made inualion upon the Ros mane Couvire. Some againe hab rather refer it unto Antiochus. And againe fome buto Pompey the great , and lulius Cafar. But , there bee many thinges which will not abmit of anie of thefe interpretations. The latter writers refer it onlie to the Kinges of Alia, and Agipt, who are fuchen of in at that chapter. The which jungement, and interpretation, as 3 bor not furclie reject: fo am I withall refolute in this , that those two Empires are tipes, and figures to the Churche, of furbthinges as thouler befall , euen after the comming of Chrift. Chercfere this is mine opinion: Firtt that thole two Singvomes (tubercof Daniell fpeakethin the laft place) are neither fain thould be Monarchies, neither are they focalled. but onlie kingromes: the which two hall outsturne, al whatfocuer that bee left remaining, of the Romane Empire in the South and Call. And of thefe two Kingbomes or Kings, the one faith Daniell thall come out of the South the other from the Both, And this Botherne fellowe fhall frike the areater terrourinto this fait Monarchie. Det both thefe Kings. or Kingbomes, hall with thippes , Chariots ,antiporfemen, that is, by fea and land, affaulte the fourth Monarchie, and the remnaunts thereof. And againe , either of their Bings fall fucceffinelie, one after an other , lap bould upon Leipr , that is , lubbuethe fame , and thereof poffeffe great trealures of Bould and Silver. Laftlie, they fhall poffelle Lybia, that is, the Region of Creen, and Libiopia, which is Arabia, Thefe pointes therefore I take to be uttered by Daniell , as indifferentlie touching , and concerning both the faio Kingbomes. but not respecting the fourth Monarchie, and Kingdome of the Romans. Aftermarb, in the 44 verfe, thefe two king. bomes are compared together, and that of the South is faibe thould be biffurben by that of the Morth, which lieth Cafternlie. So that the Southerne Kingbome foulb be in time the firft, and that of the Morththe latter. And as for both of them, they floulde nitch their tents betweene two Seas, and the holiebill, that is towards Inden : but in the enbe, they fall come to their enbe, and finali beftruction , and none fhalf peato them fuccour.

And touching the ruine and ouerthrome of this prece or part of the Romane Monarchie , or rather of this that lay Cafternlie, than of the other occibentall Empire: God would haue it fore-fbewed by Daniell to the lewer, because the veaple that inhabited the Caffernlie bead of the fand Romane Donarchie, were better knowne to the lewes, their thofe of the totelt, which owell beyond the Syriacke Sea, and fo were remoued farre of: neither had they as per bone any harme bite to the Pewer. As for the overthrow of the Italian or occidentall Empire, it is plainly reueiled in the Apoca. So that by comparing of both thefe together . I meane of Daniell and the Reuelation, we have made knowne unto be whatforuer concernes the becay , either of the orientall and Conffantinopolirane, or the occicentall and Iralian Empre, or whatfoeuer elfe is behafeful for be to know for our comfort tourbing the flate of the world , cither in the Call or Zeleft parts, euen to the end thereof.

ZOTE know by the Romane biltories, that there were beab. lie and continuall warres betweene the Constantinopolitane Emperdure and those of Parthia, and after with the Perlians who bit fitteete the Parthians, For after the beath of Alexander the great, when as for a while the Parthians had lined unber the obeplance of his fuccellours, namely the formes of Bing Saleucus: they then began, binber the conduct of Arfaces, by plucking their necke out of poke, to enfraunthise them felues into libertie, and to reare bp a kingbome among them, ralling the Kings of the Parthians, Arfacides, after the name of their first Captaine. Thele raigned unto the time of Alexander fonne of Mammaus, Emperour of Rome, and to the fourth peare of his kingdome, which was in the yeare after the birth of Chailt 228. In which very years one Artaxerxes a Perfian, killed Artabanus King of the Parthiant, the laft of the race of the Arlacides. This man therefore fratching to himfelfe the Empre and kingbome of Parthia , conuciqued it bnto Perfia, and thepotteritie of this Artaxerxes and Per-Garie Compare, continued unto the bates of Heraclius the first. Emperour of Constantinople, which was in the pere of Christ fire hunored thirtie fire, and to latted in the whole almost thie hundred twentie nine peares . Aboutthis time now began the kingbome and Cinppie of the Saracens . For in the Dairs of Heraclius and Mahumetes raigned Syrochas the latt Terlian Bing faue one: at whose hands Heraclius by compolition . recourred whatforner his Aunceltours had at any enne before taken from the Empre of Coustantinople . So thefe two kingbomes of the Parthians , and of the Perfians, mbich mutually fucceeped each other, were terrible indeede for the time, as appeareth by biffories, buto the Romane Monarchie.

Donarchie , and to the Conflutionopolitane Emperours : burvet they neither facked, nor dreatly faked the Gafferne. Dr Conftantinopolitane Empire ; nap, the Emperoura of Constantinople heald it out lufteh with them at euen hand, and flourly mabe their part and anamiftthem. But the firth batterie that made the fair Conftantinopolitane Empire to fronpe, was (as I faib) in the Caft, South, and Morth, perfourmed by the Sarracent, who make the first of whole two Kingbonits, fpoken of by Daniell, which was to rife from the South, and fo fprend it-felfe ouer the face of the earth, in fuch fort, as it thould affaile the fourth Wonarchie. both by Sea and by land, in Afia, Syria, and the Moth. Catt. And in truth, the Sarracens bib fo fore amion the faib Cafterne Empire, that it was never able aftermarbs to recouer it-felfe, but began there-woon by little and little to broune and Drop away : for they with great expedition , euch like lightning, ouer-ramue Syria, Cilicia, Cappadocia, and Mefopotamia, all which prouinces, they pull and pollet from the Confantinopolitane Emperours : where-in , the berie words mbich Daniell vieth, Cabar, 1.40 fpeaking of the Kingbonie of Sarracens, are to be observed. In fuch fart, as they heatp the fame in their possestion a tong time as they bio degres, and enioped the golo, fluer, and all the treafuces that we'le to be pelireb of those mations by the fpace of 192, peares, and buto the peare of our Land 1051, what time they were themfelues banquithen by the Tarke . Rowe that the Sarracens are a Southerne people, there is no man that is ignorant. Thus therefore ftanbeth, that which Daniell affirmeth of the firft kingbome, which fould ouerthowe the Romane and fourth Mouarchie, and that in the Call and South. Ind this tein: pelluous flure bappened in the world , and came from the Bouthrene coaft there-of, where-as the Countries of the Agarens, DI Sarracens do Ipc.

For thefe make that fecond Ringbome, which was to rife out of the Borth-Caft, and which peterly brought to nought the fourth Monarchie in the Caft, South, and into the other regions which were enuironen with the forelain Deas : which allo fet fote into Agipt, oppielt Inden, and entoped golbe , filuer, and the pleafant things of the whole world, by the space now almost of 200. peares. Thefe therefore walted by Sea and land, with wonperfull fucceffe the Caffernely bead of the laid fourth Monar. thie. And thefe alfo pitched their tents, and kept their chicfe Mattaice & place of refinence in that part of the morle, which is inclofed within thefe two Seas, where of I haue fooken. about the hill Taurus and Syria of Damafeus, before the comming of the Tartarians, and before they had furprised Gonfrantinople. For in that part, at firtt, the greateft part of the Turkilb Empire was effablitheb . Doin there is none that maketh boubs that the Turks are rifen of the Scithians that Dimell ift the Caft. And thefe were more terribleto the Romaner , then mere the Sarracens, as also Daniell peferibeth. who alfo are reported flouly fuccede, and in time to come atter the fain Sarracans; for the kingbome that is fait flould come out offife Mosth-Caft, is fooken of buddaniell in the feroup place. And this prophesic agreeth with the florie of things bone: for the Tarks Die fuppreffe the Empire of the Surracengat what time they were by Hormilda King of Per-64 firred up and alluged our of their countries cand afterward (which allo Dan, fore-tould thould come to vaffe) they mere mane fellow-pareners of the Empire, by Mahumet the Sar. racen, being Sowdan of Perfia, Sogdiana, and Media, because he was not able to match in power with Calipha, the Saracen of Babylon. Thus therefore the Sarracens being fet by the fabble, the Turks enioped the Empire, and raigned in Afia & Syria full out the tearme of 192, peares, but afterwards, being molefted by the Tartarians, and Affumbeans, Bings of the

the Parebians, their newcodnas forne-what appolled , and almost brought to the fott call. After that, in the reare of pur Loid 1300, wheer the raidne of Romanus Diogenes. of mnerour of Confrantinople, the baufe of Ortoman telloged the Curliff Empire to bis former bignitie. the receucie where of, was the full and fmall ouerthrowe of the Cafferue and Constantingoolitane Empire, Soo, the houndes of the Turkift Entere are now become the very fame, which were the timits of the Defentall Empire of the Momanes, but as for the Decisentall and Italian, he thall never far his functo on it, because this noution of the fourth Monarchie, formeth in the Roueli Cap!'rg. ra. 1 2. &c. to be allotteb butd Juti. chift. It pleafed the Spirit of God, that thefe points fould be feuerally handled, to the ende that the goody thould be the leffe offenbed, when they for them accomplished, both because they are brought to paffe by the will of Boo, for the triall of the faithfull , and againe their comming was fore-tolbe, to frike the areater terrour into the bearts of the wicked.

Mow Paule telleth be hore with what after and finnerters this kingbome was heald by and frengthied, the which be maketh to be of two forts, the one, thiefe and principall, as, the working of Sathan, and that, mightie and effectuall : the other, inferiour, as feruing to the other, which he calleth Signes, and wonders : but with-all he abouth, what manner of ones they flould be namely, Lying : and againe, to what ende they tended, to wit, to bereive men, and hold them in all wickedneffe and errour. All which points containe in them both fingular comforts, and profitable confinerations a forewarnings of those things which afterward infued, And touthing the matter of confolations , affurebly they are most fweete and behouefull . fring there can nothing more acceus table be reported, then that all those things which are bone amainft the bourne of Chiff, (and that to the great admiration of men, in fuch fort, as that they thould tearne them Minacles and Wonders) are not mithftanding nothing elle 20 but but beteftable practifes of Sathan, and falfe miracles. And as for fore-warnings, this place is also furnisht with fuch, where-by men are enabled to perceive how it commeth to paffe, that all the world is fo eafily brawne into that errour. If ay where as fome to indeede oblerne the fame, they wonder and are aftented, marueiling how fuch a thing could fo eati-Ip be brought to paffe. And in the end, thus they refolue buon the matter, faping, except the religion of antichift (which inbeebe is nothing elle but a flat blafphemie) were the true Doctrine of Gon, it would neuer haue bin fo eaflip receiueb. nos effablifbeb boon fuch a fubbaine : but the aunfmere id eaffe, Bob hab fore-tolbe that all thefe things foulb thus come to paffe, and that he would give fuch power buto Sathan : the which prophecie , and with-all, fuft inderment of Gob, could nor but be accomplifhed. Mow, why God would baue it fo, and that byon berie full caufe, the reafon fall be after renbieb.

And to the ende this mine affertion might be throughlie frengebnet, Thane to alleabge a place berp like bnto this. out of Math. 24,24. And againe another which is in Reuel. 16.14. And laftly, the example of the Magitians and Enchaunters , which reutteb the truth , as Paule alleabneth. 2. Tim. 3. 9. all which to make plaine by what meanes the e. nemies of the beauenly truth baue alwaics withtrobe the fame, fo that we are not now to thinke it Grange, if this verie madife be afcribed , to the pollicie of Antichift and Sathan. (who bath in hand to mothe this whole mplerie of iniquitie) and to the fleights which be pleth in mainteming this his kingbome againft the bodtine of Chaift, and indebe, reafon it-feife both peets no lette. For feeing that the hingbome of Antichrift, is in truth, a berie bemauation of the kingbome of Thiff, but pet an imitation of the fame, it muft neeven he. that as the kingbom of Chiff is upheald by thefe two things efverfally, to wit, the bottrine of the truth, and the power of Bobs fpirit, as Paule witneffeth, 1. Theff. 1.5. So the hing. bome of Antichill bath to oppole other two things, namely,

his errours against found bocteine, and his implactes of brooks of Bathan, againft the impracles and nower of the botte @utrit, that he might caft a most before mens eves, and handle the marrer fo as he might be taken for Chrifthim felfe, Cor fo at latt both he easily obtaine fo much, as that he is reputed for berie Chrift, when as he maketh open thewe of the verie works of Chaiff, of his bactrine and nipractes, and like a micked wiereh treacherouflie counterfaire the fame, Therefore in fear of the truth, Antichnit bach nothing elfe but lies e wickeb errour (wherein he both murie to Gob) in flead of the power of Gobs Spicit which watketh miracles, he blurteth out his wonders. For Chill fending his Apollies, topned thefetwo together, Mark. 16, 15, 8c.

And firft where-as Paule faith, that the comming of Antithill thould be by myracles : the word Comming, is to be referred not to bis first appearing, but to the whole firength, furniture, frame, and maintenance ofthe farolingbome : torthele woods, his comming, lignific thus much, his establishment, flap, and ouer-fpreading power, that be atchieuce by the meanes and force of Sathan, working miracles, Ellich two points have indeede luftely cularged the flate of loonery. and with ail, they bo very linely point, and paint out the fame buto be. For what is more common or bfuall among them. then this vaunting of infinite inpractes ; and what one thing Do they more earnettie bige and fecke for at our hands' Affice realy the Turkes, and followers of Mahumet role at first by batching a new kind of wicked bottrine, but as for myracles, they neither boatt that them-felues bib ener perfourme them. neither bo they require fuch at the hands of others. But as for the Baville, they repole the top and toe, the But, and marke , and affured ancher-hold in the matter of inpracted : and hence is it that they to crake of them with fuch open mouthes, and caft them in our teeth : fo that Poperie can not be better beferibed bitto be, nor more plainely befeinheren for the verie kingbome of Antichaift, then by this fpeache of Paule.

VV ho be those three Spirits, where-of mention is made in the Reuelation, and are faid to be the chiefe ministers of the Antichristian kingdome.

The 35. Chapter.



D the former expolition, it is eafle to be knowne (I meane to farre-forth as concerneth this place lignifie, which are fent by the falle Prophet buco ell the Kings of the earth, to plant and effablifh his kingbome. And they are fait to be like buto frogs, but the place it-felle is in the 16. Chapter, berle 13. 14. which

are thefe. 12. And I fawe three vncleane spirits like Frogs come out of the mouth of that Dragon, and out of the mouth of that Beaft, and out of the mouth of that false Prophet.

14. For they are the Spirits of Deuils, working myracles, to goe vnto the Kings of the earth and of the whole world, to gather them to the bartell of that great day of God Allmightie.

Some in erpounding this place, bo thinke that this number of three is put bowne (as fet & limited) for that which is parcercaine a infinit, as it is spoken in Salomon, A three-fold coard is not eafily broken. Therefore in their opinion thefe three fpirits are euerp fpirit ftirred op & fent abroad by Satan for the maintenance of this kingbome of lies, futh as infinite numbers of me, a claw-backs of Antich.baue bin, both liuing as per, a bear long fince, furh as was Eckius, a others, who befended the fame with toth a naile, and promoted it to the utmoft of their power. But others fæme to come nerer to the true meaning of place, for they take regard of p nuber of 3. as indeed it is to be oblerued : but pet they bo not fitly prough reftraine the fame only to Diuines, or Sozbonius to Monks,

and profesiours of the Decretalls . For my part therefore has uing abuilebly weighed and confidered of all things. It take thefe three Spirits, to biffinguifh three chiefe and principall bearees and conditions of men, by whom, as it were by Legates and choile inftruments and especiali Patrones, both Poperie it felle and the whole kingbome of Antichiff was at firt framed , erected , and enlarged , and twhereby even to this bay it is cherifhed and maintained. For whereas Chrift had for the publishing of his kingboine thele three eluciall Degrees and orders of Minifters, to wir, Apoffles, Doctois, or Cuangeliftes and Bifbops : So Antichrift hath on the o ther five his Carbinalle, Schole-men and Bilhops,

The Carbinals of Antichnil wil needes feeme to refemble and be answerable buto the Apostics of Ebill, whole nower is to fretch to every corner, and not to be limited buthin the precincts of aup one Countrie. And as touching Doctors and the firft Quangeliftes, which at the beginning of preaching the Golpett, were inteperable companious of the Apo. flesthey are matched (a Boos name) with the Schole-men (as they are called) that is, the whole rabble of Soubiffers. and order of Doctors, either fuch as profelled and lived a fecularelife, or a regulare, as themfelues terme it, that is, a Monkith or Cloyfter-life, Lattly, concerning Chriftian Bilthong: the Bilbons of the Bones orners, and of the Deuills making are in flead of them.

And unboulecoly all those orders and bearces, are the berie nillers of Boperie, who are fent by the Bone, or that falle Diophet, in divers manners and upon feueralf occasions binto the Kings of the earth, either as Wellengers,or as limple Legates, on Legates a latere, according to the qualities of the bufines that this kingbome had to bituately, and all of theht affemble themfelues to marre against the coolie and Saines in Geddon-harma, that is, in that place where olde Rome onte frobe: which place affurebly is the bery fhonne wherein all treafons and practifes agaynt Bob and his annoynted , are a 3 formeb.

Rom,

12000, this lentence and interpretation of mine, is ratificb by the circumitatice of the time, and by observation of the Similitude which Iohn hath ween, and (which is efpecially to be obferueb in thefe Brophecies) by the bery euent or iffue of things, which is an omnitufficient witneffe and ervolutour of this Dophictic. So then, thefe Spirits are lapo both to bee these, and allo to be buffinet and biuers the one from the other. all hough they be all fet forward by one and the felfe-fame autho; Sathan,o: rather bis forme, that beteftable falle prophet, that is the loope. And as for those Cardinalis, Sophifters. and Bouiff Bielates: who can more tufty be lapo to be their Sire than Sathaffifmfeife and what is their bocerine their life, and pideufe but onte beuillifb's

Furiferstiefe effer are lapo to be bneleane Spirits . For being that they are fitereb by by the Denill , who is an oncleane Spiritite chance be ebafen but that they muft bee like

their father, gind proceife of his worker. Lagip togeblig the time wherein thefe chings began: that alle frengel furth and up boutvett um renture. For lohn Belbert, that thele begin to bee fent ofter fuel time as a way mas lafen oven , for the Brings of the Eaft, and the river Enphrates, which before time was as it were a facren houndmarke of the Romane Crippietn the Caft , and feuered the fame from foreaigne Dattons, when Eupbraces, 3 fap,began to bee ag it were bated up,and to give pallage to the Cafferne people, which brought unter foote the Constantinopolitane Emperones. This people and Jaction were the Turkes, and Tattariant , who being the firft that euer paffeb oner Euphrates, brake up, and as it were bifpaled the auncient limites of the Romane Compire cano fo made in-roades and inuaffons las Elinue lave)intorije Romane Bonarchie. And chie han-Hence about the pears of our Lord toet. After which time efpecially; the Schule-inen and Popill Ponker (forthere were orifer Doubles tong before that, both more holic and betfer to'bee boine with , then thale that now are of the populb moleffion) beganto haue Demes and Cloyficts, as it were Caftles and Block-houses of Poperie in curry blace to bre founded , built , and bilperfed, namely, after the peare of out Lord 1 200, as appeareth by histories. But as for Carbinals: the order of them began long fince the other, who neverthes leffe crept up fince the power of the Tarks began to bee fo great, and have obtained fuch credite at the handes of Rings that they can at a becke turne and winde them to what purpole thep lift . For although Gregorie the first (who lived before fuch time as the Turker made invalion byon the Romane Emppre)inhis Epiffles 15.77.and 79.make mention of Carbinalis . Det that maieftic and power that now is al. lotted to a Carbinalibip, is but an invention of this later time and age : the which fome aferthe buto Gregorie the 11. who reduced the Court of Rome , from being frated at . 4venion , buto Rome : but fome other who bo moft taucur Carbinalls , bo attribute it buto former Bilhoppes. Laffly,teuthing the name of a Bilhoppicke; that affuredly is moft aunrient , in as much as it is often fpoken of in the bolte Serinture, as 1. Tim, 3.1,2,&c. But fuch as it is now in the flate of Poperie , it is fresh and newe , as being brought up long after the time of the Qualles , or of luch as liueb necre after them . yea . after the baies of Bernard Clarevallenfis : in fo much as the Audani, who lived in the bales of Conflantine the great , by occasion chiefly of the unwonted infolencie of Bifhoppes, and fuch as was never beart of before, foronke backe from the lociette of the Church . And affureble the Bifhoplie Jurifbiction that now is in the Church of Rome , is not Euangelicall, but flatly Sathanicall @ Deuillith. which hath turned all things to ambition , coueteufnelle and mibe: whereof I will fpeake the leffe in this place . because both Maiffer Caluin,lib.4.of Chiffian Inffitution Cap. 7. And Charles Molinæus in hie booke Contra paruas datas , boe feeme to me to have bery fufficiently banoled this popul.

To conclube , the fimilitude which Iohn pfeth in calling them Frogges , peelbeth lufficient ffrength unto this mine interpretation: for as Frogges are uncleane creatures, lining

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in more, full of nople, tevious and importunate in their continuall croaking : fo alfo are thefe three orbers of a very fluttilh kinde of tife , and almaies molt clamorous, in bering the wertunus and Sainces of Bobs : which to bee true, the bery thing it felfe, and their imposturate out-cries and inucctives ur enery place of the toosio against the aftentbies of the faith. fall, bo plainly bertare. and of t. Tabetellagen, drawell and . I done if

Why the myracles that were wrought for the credite of the kingdome of Antichrift are termed by S. Paule, Lying wonders. - ,

The 36. Chapter.



Aufng thus mabe thefe things plaine , let be profecute the other poputs which concerne the fubtile practifes of Antichrift nar inceyear, fapro Paule (by effermall working) and w ##on dura use, with all power. By which mornes

be grueth be to bnberfant, not only that Sathan foulb worke , but alfo that he thould morke effectually and with all his might. That the power of Sarhan thould be areat aud bis craft and fibrifrie peepe, it is plaintie fore-tould . Tittefpert wiercof it is fapo of Chift, that Sathan fould mewent, furprise, and febure, almost the very elect and chosen of Cob. Clibereppon Auftin ppon the 9. Pfalme fapth : Sathan thall in those daies perfourme so great workes, that many thereby will bee readie to thinke, that God hath cast off all care of humane affayres : Power he will exercise in His kingdome, and librilitie he will thewe in his myracles. For northing (faith tie) is more fitting with fooles, the thar which they lee and perceive with their fences, tib. De veilitare eredendi ad Hoperine cap. 16. Che which that Sathan might berfourme ; be morkes and makes thewe of myzarles: which Paule in this place calleth (anugar Signes, and reca-Te) wonders . Dow, fomethere ate that pur bifferente betweene thefe two wordes: but in mine opinion it needes not. For Paules purpole is to freme that Antichill fould by the beine of Sathan worke no bluall and common kinde of mira. cles , but fuch as were rare and wonderfult , that fo be might brame men into errors : and to bee foot, that he flould counterfaite as neere as was politible , thole excellent workes of Chrift , whereby the truth of the Gofpell was at firft fealed. Dfthele miracles, fome are fuch ao the Daniftes breame are ordinarily and bapfic perfourmed by their men; and fome as gaine are fuch , as they tell be were long and bone about the craucs of their Daincts and religious perfons : whereby a number of Superfittions mereratiffen . and efnecially that foule and blafphemous error of praying to Saincts, as being our Debiatours, or Interceffours to Goo . And of this forte they can reckon be bp a thouland. For the Davilles san fetch with a wet finger a miracle to perfmate any popul they lift, be it neuer fo fortiff and repugnant to the word of God; wherby they may perfmade fooles to give credite to every bead and part of their erronious bortrine . The which I would bargely far oven, but that their bookes are full fluft with fuch topes . But where it is appen by Paule , that thefe are but. Lying miracles, wrought in all craft, and decemblenes of vnrighteouines . It is meant wee thould gine but little credite unto them , and bee affured, that (notwithflanding the fame') the betteine of Antitheff is nothing true . For freing they are but lying figures, and that wer are at no band to betecue tred : the are like wife in no tate confue credite to those fignes alto miratles. Therefore me fay with Auftin, lib. De wnitate Ecclefia cap. 18. Let them give oper thefe allegations, which are either the cogging couzonings of deceiptfull men, or the straunge illusions of lying Spirits. For either they are false that are reported, or if there bee

any perfourmed by Heretikes; wee are the more to be-

ware of them. Dow, thefe fignes of Sathan are called Ly-

ing , in two respects. First , in regard of the things them:

felues, for that for the most part they bee but meere illusions: not

timecue

northething it till which feemethe obee done, and bo appearer the other execution for execution by mergineer of the enne for which they are thoughts. Forther mer performed by Aurelinite of because they are designed to be the distribution of the d

Dom , out of all that bath been fpoken, it is eafle to bce mathered , that only the unfaithfull and fuch as bo not appertaine to the number of Goos elect , thall flicke to the boc. trine and kingbome of Antichiat . who ground their faith nochmon the morbe of BDD, but upon certaine great anb wonderfull miracles : and as for fuch fellowes , it was an ealle matter for Sathan almaies to becetue them . But this fhall neuer happen to fuch as are goblie, truelie faichfull indeebe , and the chofen children of @DD . hoth becaule thep are heald up up the bande and Spirit of the Lorde. leaft their fatth farle: and alfo because they baue regard onlie to the morbe of ODD, from the meleript whereof thep will not fuffer themfelues to bee carieb . Whereby it commeth to palle, that the whole kingbome of Antichill is no. thing elle then a confeverate route that give credite unto the lping beceipts of Bathan , men eftraungeb from the mates of faluation , whom wee for our partes are neither to allowe nor like of.

That

That not every perticular man which heretofore lived, or is yetalive, either did, or doth approve of the king dome of Antichrift: no not when it had presside and goven the type hand.

The 371 (hapter.

Dw followeth the eight and laft point of this bilberein queftion is mabe, who they bee that fhait fteke to Antichiff , and to what ende thep foulb fo bo : and this poput feemed needfull to be abbed in two reforcts. Firft, that ODD might by that meanes comfort the crobbie. Leaft otherwise they thouse pouts that themselves flouid alfo with others be carried away with the ffreame, and prowned in the gulfe of fo great impletie. Indeede we are according to the aburrtifement of our Sautour, carefully to fand byon our quart; and with all the powers of our mindes to cleave fait to found boctrine : but leaft in the means time we flould faint for feare, as thinking that God bath no fuch care of ba: we are to reft our felues boon this affurance, that only the Reprobate thall followe Antichrift: for God promifith to beliuer and fet be free from the participation and fellowthin of fo areat a blafphemie . Secondly, this poput mas alfo in an other refuect to bee abbeb , namely, that fo a reafon might be rendzed of to great a judgemet of God erecuted und men. Corothermile men would in wondering be either amased at it, while they flould heare of le hune and horrible a bifper flou and bauocke of the Church that flouid enfue : orela they would power out opprobries, a blafuhemous freeches as mainft Gob himfelf,as if he were to to ricorous and feuere a Tuone. But when o caule is poloed for which al thele things are inflicted a brought to paffe, a withal beclared upon thom thefe tuogemetamulease a take placerthen is althis murmue ring of nichtalin apptaleous the gooty a fuchas feare Goo . . . ideni F 2 are

Spain to the first

are thereby taught and inftructed . A like place unto this is that of Math, 24,24. Whereby wee fee that the worde of Bob is alwaies agreeable and like unto it felfe. But berein the Schole-men baue themet themselues foolift aut ouer-cu. rious . in prefuming to fet bowne the number of them that fould repayle and relie upon Antichill . The which Viguerus, and Methodius haue attempteb. But it fall be a great neale more fafe for by to far our fubarements boon the worde of Gov and bould that indeede the number of men is infinite (compting them by the poule, or one by one) which fhall intbrace this blafphemie , but pet not enery perticular man mbich thall then be liuing thall be febuced . For as it is in the Reuela, 18.2. All people and nations, and inhabitaunts of the earth should drinke of the wine of Antichrist, and the whore of Babilon : pet not every feuerall man thall prinke of that cuppe . For bo the great mercie of God fome mere preferred from that infection; which perfeuered in the true faith: although inoced the number of fuch was but fmall. For as Chill both not bring query manto faluation ; fo netther both antichtift bring al to perbition. For whereas Paule faith, 1. Tim, 2.4. God would that all men should bee faued: That, without all boube, is to be underflood not of cuery perticular of each Mation but that of each Mation, fome thall be faued : the which in like forte is to bee unperflood of Antichift, when he is fayo in the Renel to infect and befor al men mith his contactous preamed.

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That only the reprobate, and such as are for saken of God hane, and that stiffely and obstinately fick to the kingdome of Antichrist.

The 28. Chapter.

Thich, feeing it is most true, let be nom fee who they bee that thall in fuch oblinate manner crive their confest and approbation, of fuch hapnous impietie impietic againft Gob, and his facred word. And thofe are the bubeleeuers, and reprobate, who are not the children of God; and therefore Paule tearmeth them απολλυμένους, fortome, or loft children. And thefe be the berie perfons, whome the Stripture in other places, as namely, lude, in his Eniftle calleth, Menlordeined, and appointed to fuch condemnation, Jude verf. 4. And Chaift faith , that They are not plants of his Fathers planting, Math. 15, 12. John 15, 2. They are therefore only the rebells, reprobates, and calt-a. mapes from Gob; that tha!! alwayes with fiffe nechs fand buto Antichrift, but not one of the elect and true children of Bob : where in alfo the indgement of God against them avpeareth to be tuft, for fuch periff, as are worthie of beath, and none other. For the morb a mondunevous loft, fignifieth fuch as are morthie and have beferued lofing, datherefore neither the godly nor the faithfull being fupported by God, fhall at any time be ouerthrowne by Sathan ; no not though they line in the mioft of this defection : although notwithfanding the number of them (as I have fait) was alwaies little ; themfelues bwelling in beferts, and being fuch as were unknowne among other men : for then was accomplished that which was monbected of by John , namely, that The Church of God should flye into the wildernesse, Reucl. 12, 16, and there fould fre bid for a feafon.

VV hat iust cause the Lord had to punish the world with this plague of blindnesse, that it (hould admit of this miferable flate of the Antichristian kingdome ; and further, what monfrous contempt of Gods word weat before this flate of Antichrift.

The 39. Chapter.

L' Arthermore, why Goo would have thefe wicked and rebellious wretches to flip, and fall into that fo grieuous an Apoltacie, Apoliacie, Paule peelbeth a realon, and that a berie fufficient and juft one. For although the Lord bath alwayes moft up. right inducements for all his becrees and inogements, For all the wayer of the Lord are truth and judgement, Pial. 25. to, and though it be not necestarie that we thould be mabe prime there-buto: pet, to the em that The wiledome of God should be instified by her children, Marth, 11.19, and that they there-by might be the more arengefmen , it pleafed the Spirit of God to vielb a reafon and caufe. of this fo great ann fearefull a mogement of God buyon the whole world, which afterward infued. Aur this was it, beraufe the morte through bifobebience, and unbeliefe, had beferued that beaute whath, and those grienous puniffments at the hands of Gob, For mas not this a perie foule and monftrons kind of ingratitude towards Goo , that his facred Gofpell, where of they could not be ignozant, but had already heard it before preached, vea. and had well perceined the power and maieffie of it, foulb notwithstanding be louthed by them, and trampled unter fore and that in ficab there of, the beniles of men, the errors of Derctikes, impictics and Superfittions of all forts, againft the holp word of God bim-fette, fhould publikely be brought in, and with the areat liking and approbation of all forts of men, admitted into the Church, befenbeb, pea and preferreb before the truth of God it felfe. Zahat impierie could be greater ; what injurie, I pray you, more erceffiue and hatnous, could there euer be offered by mortall men, buto the liuing Gob, who is tealous of his glorie's Therefore this puniffiment brought upon the world and the Church, is a riale Endianote that is a most just revenge inflicted buon the mochers of his name and word thankintag, beribers and froffers, men that are fet bowne in Thomers chaire. Elibence it is that Paule calleth the fame punifment warading verf. 12. a condemnation , iva nestao. (faith be) that thefe contemuers might be bamped , and committed to togture. A herefore this leneare proceeding is a full punifhment of extreame wickeoneile, blatphemie, and buthankefulneffe of men

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men towards God. For the word neiveadar (indneb) both in this place figuifie, not fo much an examination which Cap maketh of the caule, as a indicial cenfure, a berbict of conbemnation, and execution of punishment. And herein affurebly the faid Antich, as well as the bivell himfelf, mas the erecutioner.

Acraine, we are with-all to take efpeciall observation of the behemencie of the fpeache which the Spirit of Gob in Paule, bath bled to expresse thefe abhominable wretches ; for there-by it will the more appeare, how excelling the contempt mas, which they had of the Golvell and more of God, the reuence where-of is to horrible, and indebe to great, that it feemeth there could not pollibly be invented a greater. To this purpole therefoge appertaineth that which Paule abbeth, and that not iblie or to no purpole, in thefe words.

1. They received not : then, the Gofpell was offered unta them : fo that there-by their nealest and buthankefulneffe appeareth fo much the greater.

2. The loue : that is, that fweete and comfortable bottrine. to greatly to be befired, which ffirreth by , braweth to it, and thereth the bearts and confriences of men.

2. Of the truth : tubich is a thing of it-felfe worthy great price and estimation, and to be preferred farre before the beuiles of men what-fo-ener.

The which truth, Paule commending by the effect it hath. faith. By it men might be faued. for that preaching of the Safnell, is the inframent or meaner whereby they are brought unto Chrift, in whome only our fafetie both confift. Therefore the word Truth, is in this place by may of preeminence, fet bowne for the bottrine of the Gofnell, Te was therefore a beteftable and lauabne kind of unkingneffe. for men in that fort, to fet light by fuch great and precious giftes of Gob, nay, it was more then barbarous and beattlie careleinelle and impietie . which beforgen this fea ueare punifhment, and tharpereuenge. Laftly, Paule both pet further amplifpe this grieuous contempte of God (ale though notwithstanding it is hainous inough of it-felfe) leaú leaft perabuenture it fould feeme to bs a light matter, or a fmall offence. And he both aggrauate the fame both in renard of the manner how they embraced ; and of the height whereunto like mab-men they abuaunced this their rebellious and blafphemous behautour againft Gob. For he faith thep bib it eudoxioavrec, hauing pleafure in it, with fuch a belire, lo willingly, and in furh greedie and earnett manner, that therein they greatly pleafed them-felues, they like and allowed of it, they take great belight in it; and wittingly and willingly made accountry of it, as of a most pure and precious boctrine: and laftly, that they preferred it before the beauenly word of the Lord Gob fum-feife. And affureblie this is the bigbeft fley of mabnelle that can be, for men, not only like fors to abs mit, and approue of lies in fteab of truth, but to reft and repofe them-telues there-in quietly, contenteblie, and in inpfull fort : pea, with Arettheb-out armes to cinbrace the fame, to forthe and folace them-felices in it, although in the meane trine their confriences bo there-in greatly grutch & repine againg it. Laftly, the fame Paule abbeth this as an op-fhot, of this billanie and raging madnelle committed againft Gob, that the fame matter which thefe men fo greenely purfue, and fo entirely embrace, is nothing elfe then meere Varighteoufnes. Wilhere in, their condemnation was the greater, and their punifbment the more fuft. For it is maft fuft a bpright, that fuch as allow of, and mainteine burichteouines, thould be moft fegearely punifhet, Pfal 94. And where as he calleth this impletic fimply Iniuffice, or Varighteoufnes: he thereby gineth be to unberftand, that in this flate of antichrift, which is the flace of popery, God is not offenore, or his kine. bome violated in one point, or after one for only ; but that all kinde of iniquitie being by them admitted, is committed and bone with great liking and allowance. For as that is called righteoufnelle , where by we yeelo unto Gor and man, that which is their oue, and theme our felues conformable to the will of God in all our actions both in-ward and out-ward : to is that Varighteouines, where by we are inturious to God Son and our neighbour, theinking from the will of God either in points of boctrine, or matters of life and convertation. The mhich to be practiled and found rife in Poperie and the hingbome of Antichafft : there is none that can make boubt excent fuch as never fame the habow of it, or tafted the leaft brop of her benome. But fuch an haue learned but only the firft rubiments of that flate (which to many have bone) and afterward by the awonelle of Gon are brought to fee the true light of the Mofneil, thall affurebly perceine more cleare, then the funne at none day, bow all corruption both of found bottrine, and holy life, taketh place among them: pra and apprecied with commenbation. Therefore feeing the hamoufuelle of this Vnrighteouines, was, and is fo great, and that growne to fuch an height or begree, it is no maruaile though this fo areeuous a nuntibutent enfued in the world, that the reprobate & faith. teffe men, which molt wickebly contemned the truth of Gob, either offcen to them or acknowledged by them , thould fall into this fo cruell arprannic of foules and confciences .

An aunswere onto three certaine principall arguments of the Papifts, where-with they would instificthemselves, and approone this favd kingdome of Antichnift.

this thbole difference of Antichieft, out of & Paulo might now feme to be fully finished, but that there a remaines an bard objection of the paville, whereputo I thinke god for a finall conclusion of this treatile, briefely to oppole an auniwere, Chis their obiection relieth boon three feuerall armuments, which they bare berie famcely in way of befence both of them-felices, and of their

fain fpnacoque and boctrine. Le firft whereof respecteth and refteth boon the multisupe of thote, which both beere tofore haue profeffed, and as pet

pet to hold the fame Apollaticall, that is, Bavifficall bortrine: but hereunto the aunimere is calle. For feeing that Paul hath perp clearely belivered this point, namely, that it thould fall out, that only the elect and chilogen of Bab, thould perfeuere and continue in the true boctrine, and thofe in number be but fem but as for fuch as befuife the Gofpell, and are febuced by Satan, they are almost infinite (for the way in narrowe that leabeth to eternall life, but broade is the pathe that tenteth to Deftruction, as our Saufour affirmeth) there can not bnboub. tenip be bjonght any profe from the greater number & troupe of men, to affire be of the true marks of the Church , and to emificute us in the certaintie of the truth, & of the batteing we profester Fig by that reason were the Turks now rather to be rettonevitheerne Churth of Gab, then are the Dapille, for there are moe Turken Mabumetanes, then Papills. And as graine, in times path, the Moolatours before the comming of Cint, were to be coumpted the Church of Gob, rather then the leves for the number of Tholatours were alwayes avenrer,then was the number of the lewes. But Chrift calleth bis Church the true Church, which is the only Church of God; A fmall flocke. Luk. 12. 32, Chrifalt, Hom. 28, ad popul. Antioch. It is better (faith he) that there should be one, that doth the will of the Lord, then a thousand wicked. Ye may fee if ye will (beloued) that a great multitude of fuch as do not the will of the Lord, is not a whit better, then fuch as are not at all. Thus much Chrifoftome.

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2. The fecond argument is taken from the generall liking that bath bin of that erronious boctrine, the which (as they (av) hath bin approued by biners men, and fundy Spnobs. But I aunimere with Paule, that To it was to fall out that this Antichifftan, and Apollaticali boctrine, foulb not only be allowed of by fome men, but allo be willingly received into the berie Church, in fuch fort, as that men thould fecurelp and wonverfully repole them-felues in it : and all because that then, they toke no bue regard buto the morb of Gob. Cherefore this realon faileth, as hauting in it a fallation, fet. ting that for a cause (as also the former bib) which is none at all.

3. Laffin, the third argument which the Bapilla bie againft vs, is brawne from prefeription long time, where in the fapt Apollacie hath bin entertained, and as pet raigneth among then in great fecuritie. Einto this argument alfo I make aunfwere out of Paule, that it was to to come to paffe, that Gob fould fend fuch ffrong & effectuall errour, and that byon full occasion, that men would give care & credit boto those hes, not for a bay, but for a bery long feafon. Therefore this plea of lone pollellion that errour maketh, is fo farre from ratifying the fame, that it maketh it more great & gricuous, in that it bath febuced the moe, and fo long incroached. The fame answere Innocentius the third, Bill, of Rome, bid likemile make in a certaine Decretall Epiftle of his; for against nietie, against god manners, against h ernreste word of God. a cuftome being taken bp, and boctrine abmitteb, may at no hand prenaite by plea of prefeription, or long continuance of time, Canon Confuetud, dift. 11. For fuch things as at firft are not allowable, cannot be juffifico by continuance of time (ad the Lawrers them-felues are plaine in this point, L. Qua ab inicio, D.de Regul, Iur.) Dow if there be many other matters which by the very rules of the Dapitts themfelues, and their becrees, cannot be ouerborne by neuer fo long preferre tion of time (fuch as are the rights a buties belonging to the Rings treaturie or Erchenner, and as appertaine to the common-wealth, namely, fuch things as haue bin teft & fo)faken, for fore of hollife inuation ; againe, fuch things as are comnaffer mithin certaine mediaces and limits : and laftly, fuch as are the prerogatives belonging buto the Church of Rome tt felfe.) Zelly may not the like printebgebeawardebunto the word of God (who is Lord of Lords, and King of Kings) and pute bis Church, fo, as no melerintian of time, be it of never to long continuance, may peciabice the Lord himfelle 's and that especially , freing that those whiche beman firft to toke this nouguntage of time, bealt not fincerely, not in plaine truth, and timplicitie, without which, there there can no prescription prevaile in the Church; so then it followeth nor, that the voctrine of Joopers is therefore true, because it bath bin plauslidy admitted by a great while together, so Daniell and the Spirit of God have sope-colde it so houds come to passe; and therefore it could no otherwise fall out.

profeffeth himfelf to be Chriftes Wicar in earth, the fucceffour of Peter, the head of the Chriftian Church, the chiefe of all Bifbous , the mot Catholike of all Catholikes , a kinbe of Dracle of religion, and a mortall God among mento auduch I fap, and hould, that the fame man is the very Antichitt, att enemie to Bob, atraptor to Chrift, an aduerfarie to religion, the ring-leader of herelles, and a murberer of Boos Church. But as pe are bere prefent in bobies , fo bee prefent in attention: and if heretologe by meanes of that commo errog, which generally hath premailed , pe could not peraduenture gine right centure of that wicked montter: pet now at length lap. ing alibe confectures , thinke byzightly of the matter, and whom the Scripture bath foze-toulb, time bath bilconered, and the Church hath many aces been burbened with : acknowledge him for Antichaift , fpit in his face, and curle bint even to the pit of hell. For why fould we not both inone frelie, and fpeake plainlie in the cale 's og why fould wee at all boubt, and fragger in a matter fo manifelt, and of fuch mo. ment'Af the Bifhon of Rome be the Antichzift of whom we can make no other accompt, except we will be witfully beceinen) why thould wee either lake longer for an other, or why thould though the not call this the bery Antichiff ' I hope that after Thane bone , none of pou will boubt, but that that tollie Bithou which keepes fuch a cople , is the very and only Antichuite in fuch fort as who will not bee loft for euer, ought beterip to beteft bim and abandon bis forietie. And berein I purpole to beale fo, as the right oper of bifputation trquis reth:namely,firff,in may of confirmation,by authoritic of the Scriptures to warrant mine affertian and as for fuch areu. ments as may freme to make accapuft me. I will not mebble with them in mine Dration. For now it is my part to make plaine and frengthen the caufe, and afterward to fake of the apuerfaries obiections when I thall come to aunfwering. And firff to begin withal, I will take that buto me as graunteb, which of nereffitie muft bee peelbeb, that antichnit is in the Scriptures fet out bnto be, by bis true and infallible marken . To that wee are neither to imacine of aup other, not fnoken of in the Greiptures, but that wee confibently affirme him to be Antichift, unto whom all thofe things to fo firth agree , which wee reade in the word of God concerning Antirinitt . For cither it muft nerves bee fo. or elle the Swirit of Bob hath not well beferiben bim bato be, the which cannot be affirmed without blafuhemie.

Touch not mine annoynted) and fometime agapne , is taken for the bery Sonne of Gos mabe manifeft in the fielb, our rebeemer and Sautour Jelus Chrift: So allo in the Beriptures the name of Antichailt is fometime taken for euerp aquerfarie of Chaift, (as in the 1. Ioh. 2. There are many Antichriftes come alreadie : thatis , there begin to incroach many back-flibers , which indendur to corrupt the pure word of Oab: and fome. time against more monerly to that chiefe Antichailt tubich mallapertly thwarteth Chaift bimfelle, not only in one or two poputs, but in the whole frame of religion and king bome of Emilt. And even in fuch fence bis John fpeak of Antichailt in that perv place, when he fauth : Little children, it is the last houre: and as we have heard that Antichrift should come,&c. And of this kinde of Antichiff are those things to bee unberftwbe , which Paule mitteth in bis 2. Epiffle to the Theff.cap.2. Tam not therfore to intreate of those nettie and paltrie Antichiftes , which are many in number, and foulb fow the feed of the Apollarie, and hourible Antichriftianifine. which was counfue : but of that Captaine Antichnit, which thould in all pounts bee opposite to Chill , and of whom the other were but fore-runners. And whe I fan that the Bifhon of Rome is this great Intichtiff, mp meaning is , that be is the Captaine and head of that Apollacie, which the Scripture poputed at , and fore-themed , thould take place in the Church, for wee are not to imagine, that the whole power of Antichift is included in that Bilboy only, but that pontificall kinghome which is oppolice and contrary unto the kinghome of Chiff, is in truth to be tearmed Antichift . And feeiner the Bifhon of Rome is the head of this kingdome: I call him Antidnift . being but a part of the whole . Talberein I whollie followe the manner and birection of the Scripture : which. when it freaketh of that Antichailt, it mentioneth fometime a whole kingbome and bobie, as it were, as when Paule layth: Except

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Except there first come a defection or falling away; and, Now the mysterie of iniquitie worketh: And sometime acapne it frecifieth but fome one , being chiefe and principall in this king come, of whom beyondeth the whole bodie of this withconeffe : as when he fapth , Setting and advauncing himfelfe against whatfoeuer is called God, or is worthipped, and bearing it out as if he were a God. Thefe two pounts cannot bee unvertibote of the whole bodie, but of the head, the Bifhon of Rome himfelfe. Thus then feeing it aupeareth what I meane by the name of Antichift, let be come to the matter and thing it felfe, and examine what we finde in the Scripture concerning Antichpift, whereby all men which are not alreadie interted with o bregges of Antichriftianifine, man acknowledge and confelle, that the Romane Billop is (as I fap)this Antichift. And herein of purpole I will affect breuitie . inderouring to comprise many thinges in a fewe words, and much matter in a fmall compaffe.

All the auncient Fathers , almoft , aub many of the late miters , and thofe very learned Diumes bee affirme , that Daniell imhis it. Chapter about the ende bit fpeake of Antichift . For the things that are there woken by him, are to be referred to Antiochus only flouratinely but are moverly and in cruth to be understood of Antichrift. There are none of the loves bootours themselves, to my knowledge, that make boubt, but that the 19rophet in that place both forake of Antichift. ZZIbich if it be fo, we may even out of this place learne, who, and what manner of fellowe this antichrift Could be, for in that treatife of Daniel we may behold not affeight counterfeit , but a lively nicture of the Bifbonne of Rome. For first (layth the Hoppiet) He shall doe what him fift, And inscede, the Bope bath now thefe many yeares bone enen what he pleafed in many marters, as well Einil as Co. efeliafticall . For he takes byon him to create, tranffate, and But bowne Kings, to bischarge subjects from their oath of abenfence, and to have the like authoritie ouer al Empires and Etitarogities , to rate out, pull bowne, bring to rume and bearov:

frop : agapne, to build and plant them at his pleafure. And this power be bath put in practife, not only beretofore againft many Kings and Kepfers, but of late he tiched, as pe knowe, to exercise opon our gracious Soueraigne . And as for Cochefiafticall matters , be therein challengen to himfelfe much . more licencious libertie. For therein al bis fapings, placaros, and begrees . mere to bie accommitted as Dracles, proceeding from the Spirit of God, whatforur liked him, mult be taken for Catholike; and whatfoener aufpleafed him, was to bee reputes herericall. Though he hould brame with him infinite foules of men into bell : pet it were impictie for any man to fap, What do you? (diff 40,50 Tapa) Andit is an olde print ciple among Baniftes, which none of them bare benie, that the bare Will of the Bone is reason ynough . further , the Monthet fauth: He shal exalt and magnific himselfe about all that is God. The which allo Paule very flatly affirmeth of Antichrift, Maw, how the Bope perfourmeth this, I fhall afterward fheme, when I hall come to handle that place of Paule. Thirdip, the Dropher abreth: And he fhall profper, vntill by the wrath of God he bee brought to nought. Tatho is ignozant how wonderfullie the kingdome of Bones rie increafed, butill furb time as the Load reneiled Antichaift onto his people. Fourthly it followeth; neither fhall he regard the God of his Fathers . And fure the Romanifles haue beuiled be anewe God, which is not the true God of the Chriftians. They have a counterfaict God and a ftraunge Chaff, a neme beauen, and fuch a religion, as our gathere the Apostles neuer knewe , but fuch an one as themfelues could invent and frame for their owne turnes : the which & tuill after make manifeit . Fifthly, the Dopher writeth, He shall not care for the defires of women. The papittes, although they bee not the least effeminate men that euer were. pet they condemne mariage as betterly bulawfull among them , in all their orders and professions : in fo much as thep preferre abhominable Sobomitrie, and filthie raging luft, befare honelt and holie Matrimonie . Sittly, He fhall worthip God

Cod with golde, and filter and precious flores. But feeing there be fome that be not ag pet refolued, that Daniellin this place fpake of Antichift; or if he bio, per, that he there fpake but figuratiuely, as, unverthe perfon of an ather : let us come to the newe Cettament, wherein this Inticiniffian monfter is plainlie and clearely fer out unto be. And pet I will not profecute every place, but make inflaunce on-He of fuch moofes, as are most platne and pregnant . There was neuer any Chriftian that as pet mase boubt , that in the ferond Eviffle to the Theff cap. 2. mention is made of Antichiff . Cothercfore, let be abuilebly confider and make fearch into that place , and let be compare the Bilbon of Rome, with that Antichtil of the Apolle , who mult needes bee the verie Antichiff, that by his true and proper marks, we may learne to acknowledge the very truth of the thing. The Theffalomians has trouglie perfmated themfelues, that the comming of Chrift, and the end of the world brette neere. The Apoftle endenoureth to rio them of that errour, and withall belivereth poetrine moft neceffarte for all Chiffians . The fimple and plaine propolition whereof is this : Antichill thall come before the comming of Chiff. This Antichift be vinerflie beferibeth, that cutty Church and Congregation might knome mbat what a manner of one he thould bee. Let be fenerally confiberofeach parte of this beleription , fee bowne by the Apofle. First he fairth, Except there come first a back sliding or falling away . Mow , it is a falling from the faith that he meaneth, for his purpole was not to fpeake of the chaunges of Emppres, or overthiowes of Mingoomes; and agapne. the wonde Apoffacie both fignifie no lelle, 1. Tim. 4.1. 200surovan river the wissace Chatter They thall thrinke from found doctrine . And further , all the Fathers aine it out. that the comming of Antichail that I bee torned with a mile. rable overthowe of religion and godlineffe . And whereas the Apostle calleth it simplie an Apostacie (which should enfue.) be thereby themeto that it fould bee a acnerall, and not a perticular defection. For he fpeaketh abfolutely, methout limitation. And this map alfo more manifeffly appeare, by comparison of other places, Luk. 18 8. The fonne of man when he commeth, shall he finde faith voon earth? Chie is that Apollacie and want of faith whereof Paule fpake. Math. 24.12 Iniquitie shall be increased, the love of many thall be colde. And John in the Renelation fortelitth. That the Kings of the earth flouid commit fornication with the Harlot : and, that the inhabitants of the earth should bee made dronken with the wine of her whoredome, and, that all Nations shall drinke of her cuppe. And laftly, the event of things which is the best expositions of thefe matters, port produc that I fap to bee moft teue, If or partly by Mahumetifine, and partly by looperit, faith bath been long fince, almost cleane put out, in fo much as well nigh there is no remnant left in the world of the true and auntient faith and finceritie . After this, the apostle beginnethte beferive Antichift by his mover markes . And that, that man of sinne bee disclosed, even the sonne of perdition, which is an aduerfarie. The A. polle faith, that this man was to be reuciled that is flould onculy affect and poffette a kingbome, and exercise his eviannie : the which . It is certaine the Bone hath martifed about nine hundred poares, einen euer fince that time whercit he mould neches be callebrie head of the Church and take upon him the chiefe droake in the Church. And to the end me may cincently perceine that the Bifhon of Rome in that Autichiff (as I affirme)let us profecute the other parts of this propheticali befeription latibout by the Apoffte. De lates open Antichailt in the fourth berle following , by three abuncts or properties for first. He thall oppose and exalt himselfe against al that is called God, or that is worthipped: Secondly, He shall fit as God in the temple of God : Thirdly, He shall thewe himfelfe that he is God.

And that he moule needes be areater then Gob, we thatteafilte pereciue if we confider what power and authoritie cither of them bo challence to themfelues : Te helongeth only to Got to preferibe lawes, to binde our confeiences, who only hath the fourraigntie over our foules . The Bilhop of Rome will neeves beare rule ouer mens conferences. (wherein he attributeth to himfelfe a binine interest) ven intopneth in more hard and feuere manner, then be fuppoleth that Goobimfelfe ought to bo . For who knoweth not that a man might with greater fecuritic transareffe the lawes of Got, than the Bopes Conftitutions; and that he that flouid offend the fand Biffon , flouid in more feuere manner fmart for it, than he that flould with notorious wickennelle offend the Lord . Cobce flanned with fornications, abulteries, and unipeakeable impieries , required no great penaunce , fuch finnes could bee bone awaie at a light and caffe prices but to haue taffed once either of Booke or Beefe byon a Frps day, that could never be wiped out, but by the bloud of him that offenbeb; and vet the one flands forbibben by God bunfelfe, and the other by none but by the Biffion. They make it for the most part but a mockery or Dap-game to breake the lawes of Goo, but to tranfgreffe the Bilhops, is right mottall and beably. To hart God by permite and blafphensy they make it no great finne : but, to offeno the Bifhon only by but reuerent fpeach, is a huge trefpaffe, and worthy to be reuenged by most extreame torture. There are a thousand fuch like. wherein the Bilhon eftablifbeth bis authority to be reputed as farre more authenticall and bolie, then the pomer of Bob : Then, what is it to abuance him-felfe aboue God, if this be not & fhall we loke that Antichill fould plucke Gon out of beauen, and climbe by into his Celeftiall feate ' and the fand Bilbon is alfo an aduerfarie bnto Chift, and that not in any one parcell only, but fimply, and (natohinac) in the whole : Il will in few words make it plaine, for neither is colve more re-

puguant buto beate, or blacke to white more contrarp, then is Dopery to Chriftianitie, and the Bilhops profession, buto the bortrine of the Gofuell. For what a kinde of God bo they make of him, when they ferue fuch an infinite number of Tpols, and fill the whole worth with their Ibolatrie ; for where euer, either among the Gracians of Agiptians, of the ould Romanes, mere Tmarca more common, or more frenticke to poll-worthin, then was ; and as we knowe is in the Romith effurch and that of a forie flenber cruft, a Bob can be mabe as fone as a Brick fhall have breatheb out a feme words out of his filthie mouth : Thefeet ve (brethren) what a mannes is it and what facrifectious blafphemie againft God ': Therefore they have no God at all, and much leffe haue they any Chiff, whome they have bilhonoured, mangled, and tome in nieces in fuch monberfull fort. Cite are taucht in the Speriptures that Chift is a man; but a man be can not be if be be infinit, without circum-ferrition or limitation of place or perfon, fuch a Chrift as the Bapiffs haue breameb boon, thep make Chrift, both man and Bob, of that Wathematicall fuperficies which they ble in their Baffe, which is fo fubtile and thin, that it conteineth in it no thickneffe at all. I would beere trange of them, how, in that little bodie or fubitance, they biftinguifh or feuer the beity of Chift from his bumane nature. And what a kinde of bodic is that, which is of no quantitie, which can be perceived by no fence, which poffeffeth at once an infinite number of places , and those faire billant 'thus therefore they beffroy the perfon of Chrift, and as touching his office, they are there-in more foulie and bangeroufly beceiuch. For, what part at all bo they beere-in franc found and entire bnto Chift : If Chiff be our Bieft, and if there be thra parces of this Briefthmbe, the one, that he foould offer him felfe for our only and perpetual fartifice, the other, to be our interceffour, and make prapere for be. Dow is it that the thaniffs be offer be Chaff euerp bap, and how is it that they fubmne an infinite number of Debiatours 'If Chita be our Biophet, who will they not fant content with his botteine. botteine, to what ende bo they require further humane lawes and traditions : If he be our King, what neede we an other Bilhop to be our Ring , which thould rule ouer our conftiences, and the whole Church of Chrift ' wherefore if he be Antichaift that benies Befus to be Chaift the announced, as Iohn hath taught be : it is enibent that the Bilboy of Rome is Antichift, who hath taken away the Kingbome, Drieft. hoo, and Bropheticall office of Chrift, Tean not runne ouer each place of the poctrine of the Gofuell that therein I might thewe bow the Bilhop is contradict bnto Chrift, in enerie point; and thefe have I lightly toucht, a in feme words runne ouer, becaufe I am not now to handle common places : but briefely to pecid the reason of this my befence and affertion. Caberefore to let paffe other points, e to conclude this place, 3 affirme, that the whole boctrine of the Golpell, that letteth out buto be the causes & meanes of our faluation, and which preferibeth either the outward or inward worfhip of God; is by b Dopes meanes benzauet, (pollet, e cleane ouerthrowne: the which being fo, it followeth, that the Bilbop is rightlie called avrix imerec, an opponent of Aduerfarie. 3. And leaff any man fhould breame, that Antichrift fhould be an outward enemy, fuch as Mahumet is, Paule abbeth, that He should firm the Temple of God, that is,in p miolt of the Church: therefore he thould proue an houthold enemy, not a forraigne for, and thall withitand Chill couertly, not ovenly, although not mithfranding be thall be a beably enemy buto Thift, vet thall be metend areat faith religio friendibin, a familiar conuerlation with Chrift, whereby we may fee how much more Dangerous an enemy be is, So the Bilb, of Rome, although be be rengenant unto Chrift in all things, pet hath be placed & feared bimfelf in the mioft of the temple and people of Bob. For he holdern that himfelfe is the Ticar of Chrift. # that his fonagogue is the true Thurch of Thiff, & that all his are the true Catholicks , and crieth out, that all fuch as feparate themselues from him are Bereticks. Thus both he chaltenoge to him-felfe the title and name of the Churche, and betracteth it from all others; and this is it whiche

Paule

Paule meaneth . in faving be fall fit in the mioff of Gang Church, Many thalicome fayth Chaft in my name, faying : I am Chrift, Dow, what is it to come in the name of Chrift: but to plurpe the place or name of Chrifts Grear & And this. hard not only bin perfourmed openly by the Loope, but allo it bath fallen out, that belibes bim, no other bib euer attempt it. 3. And both not the Billiop openly boalt bim-felf to be Bob's reabe Gratian diftinet. 21. De acknowleberth the name, be' taketh it upon bim, be coumpteth it properly to belong buto bim, and repofeth him-feife in it. Die cliente clame and morthin him as a God, they falute him by the name, and make more accoumpt of his authoritie and precepts, then their of Gob. Decrein I faignenothing, I fpeake that that is entbent and well knowne bnto all, The Bilbop of Rome giueth it out, that he is an earthly Gob, and baunteth that he can bo what-fo-ener Gob can; Sinne only exception impubent and blafuhemous mouth buberto all points to tompe and agree. 25ut we have not per runne ouer the befreiption fer beime by the Apostic, if their things be not fufficient, marke what followes : Now (faith Paule) ye know what with holderh, namely, that he might be reueiled in his time. Deerem he themeth what it is that bit flay or keene backe the comming of antichiff. This fame (To nate xov) which with holdeth, Terrullian, Hierome, and Chryfostome, be unberfland of the Romane Empire, the which fo long as it flobe in flouri. thing effete, antichrift could not rife to that nomer and meheminence; and therefore that roome might be mabe for Antichiff it was requifite that the Emperour of Rome fould que place. Talbat this meaneth we thall eafily buberftand, if we fball beare in mind that which John fore-warneth in the Reuelation , as we fhall fee anone; namely, that Rome was to become the head and Detropolitane Citie for the Antichit. flian kingbome. Seeing therefore that Antichiff wag to rule in Rome, necestarie it was that the Emperour fould leave Rome emptie for him, for it could not be poffelt by both of them together. Row the iffur & event of things bath themen it felfe

it felfe, to be a most plaine and plentifull interpretour of this prophecie, Firft, Conftantine tranffaten the Empire from Italie , and Rome into Greece bato * Bizantium ; then the + which is Greeke Emperours becan by little and little, to lofe all their Conftantiinterest in Imlie, to that at last Rome, the auncient feate of the norte. Empire, together with a great part of Imilie, began to fall into the Bilbous hands. But where as fome unperftand this matter of the Breaching of the Gofpell, which the Apollie thould fignifie, was firft to be fpread ouer the face of the whole earth : I will not gaine-lap, but that both map be bus berttobe . viz. that the Empire was to be moued out of Rome, and the Golpell to be preached ouer all the world. And touching the time where-in both thele were perfourmed, it actreeth fitte. And where-as the Apoffie waiteth, that the misterie of Iniquitie doth alreadie worke : he giueth be to binberftand, that even in his time the foundations were lapbe of that pontificall befection. And further be plainely teftifieth. that this Antichill flould continue even to the comming of Chrift, when he faith, that the Lorde shall consume him with the spirit of his mouth, and shall abolish him with the brightnes of his comming. Antichtift may be annaired fome-what, and biminifhed by the preaching of the Golvell. but he cannot be wholie bispatcht before the comming of Chtift. 120m how Antichift was to get a hingbome, and obtaine a tyrannie, Paule both berein beclare, when he faith, His comming shall be by the working of Satan, with all power and fignes, and lying wonders, and with all deceiueablenes of varighteoufites among them that perifh. Tt were impollible to beter any thing more fitly agreeing with the kingbome of Poperie : for, except the Billop had a michtie, power-full, and biuclift force in working, be could never have fo prevailed by his courongmes, beceints, tricks of legierbimaine, and falle miracles.

Bitherto we have heard Paule meaching of Antichrift, and if Paule were attue Prophet, as we boubt not but he was a mott true one, it is neceffarie that the Bifhop of Rome fhoult A a.

be Antichift: I bo but point at the beads of berie wrietiete matters , for I map not now make long bilcouries. Let be come to the Apocalypie, where in, are most certaine euibentes, and plaine tettimonies of this our Antichnit : thefe, what they are, let be conliber. In the 13. Chapter, after that Iohn hat made mention of a Beaft which hat feauen beats. one head where-of being grieuouffie wounded . was aftermart mabe whole againe, (which Beaft, can not but be bne perftate of the Romane Empire:) then it felloweth in the II. berfe, And I fawe an other Beaft, comming vp out of the earth, and it had two hornes like vnto the hornes of the Lambe, but it fpake like vnto the Dragon. The 19as pifts them-felues make no boubt, but that this Beatt is Antichift : and 3 will moue that it is the Bifbop of Rome himfelfe, who profefferi bim-felfe to be the Lambs dicar, and to belike buta the Lambe : but pet if we marke well bis fpeach. we thall achnowledge bim for a Dragon, and the verie De. uill. For who euer bib bomit out more horrible blafphemies againft Goo , then this Beaft hath bone t gos ouer the reft that followeth unto theende of the Chapter , pe Gall fe all thinges fall out int by the mouibence of Gob. Cabo is is that put life into the beab image of the Beaft, but only the Bilbon, who in his newe ereded kingbome, bath liuelver. preffes and remefentes the ouls Romane and Toolatrous Empire. For loke what crueltie, couetoulnes, luft, riot, I. polatric, was long agoe found rife among the auncient Cinperours, the Bifhous haue reftozen all chat bnto the world amaine. And it is moft rertaine and apparant , that be compelleth all men that will line at all, and peale in bis bufines and offaires to beare his marke in their fore-heads, & right hands. For creept they give by their names onto him, and efferme beriten he reuerences both in word and beebe they can not live m lafetie : Kings, Emperours, Bilhops,ritth, pope,the common people,learned, untearned and all, muft ferue bin, kiffe his ferte, and morfbip this Beatt. And as conchive che number ofi666 Limen, a berte auneient father, and one that 10 liuch lived neere buto the time of the Apolites , bath opened the fame. If we muft neeves make accoumpt of Apoftolike trabitions. Who may we not thinke that this was a tradition of the Anotte & Truly the Bone is a Latine by nation, faith. publike liturgie, yea and all his adherents be will needs have to be Latines; he that is not a Latinift, they cry out that he is a Grecian, a Scilinatiche, and Beretike. If it feemed prohable buto Irenam that this frould be the name of Antichiff. hartered, Latinus, it ought to feeme much more probable bnto be, who have had perfect proofe and experience of this Antichriftian Latine. Motwithftanbing, if any hab rather referre it buto the time of his receiling, I will not greatly bilagree. For if buto the yeare 79 where-in John lineb. and wrote his Revelation, we abbethe number 666, and confider the effate of the Church what it was in the yeare 763, we Shall fee that Antichift was then growne to peares , ruling in Rome, terrible with two fwogbs, and worthipped by Chriftian men as a Bob. Mahat neche we feeke more tor what could be more plainely fore-tolbethaue we need also of a toatch-light? And per there are more entbent proofes then their, which are moft forceible to perfmade, although we were bifpofed to op. pole our felues againft them. The Spirit of Got bib foge-lee that queltion and boubt might artie, touching the place where this Antichrift thould raigne, and therefore he would alfa fore-warne all Chriftians of the place, and fo pointed out the of itie mherein Antichnift fould fit, And that is Rome, which John both calleth Babylon, and the woman that fitteth upon feauen bitles , and the Citie that beareth rule ouer the kingbames of the world. De that boubteth that Rome is this fame. I can not tell whether be have any wit at all: the auncient fathere progritood the mifterie, Terrullian contra ludeos, faith: Biebylan remefenteth in John our Bopbet, the figure of the Citie of Rome, Ierome bpon the 47. Chap, of Efay, in his Ca niff, buce Afella, in the ende of his fecond boke arrainft Iovinian, and in o proloque of his boke de fbiritu fancto, teftifieth y Rome is Babylon, & callety ber the purple coloured Darlot. Auftine ·10 · 10

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Auftine in bis 18. Boke, De Ciuitate Dei, Cap. 22, affirmeth that Rome is an other Babylon, and a Daughter of the firft Babylon. Orofius, lib 2, cap. 3. themeth by many reasons, that Rome is in all points correspondent buto Babylon. But who Do me feeke after the tellimonies of men, and wip bo merequire further profes, feeing Iohn him-felfe beclareth, that this Citie, is that which is founded boon feauen billes, Let them name me if they can, any one Citie in the mhole worlb. in Europa, in Afia, og Affricke, in the Indies, og new-found America, where-in are to be found featten billes, belives this our Citie of Rome, the which all men knowe to be built bpon feauen hilles : the braueft towne of all , that both inclofe fcauen feuerall billes in compatte of a wall, The names of which billes are as pet well knowne, Capitolinus, Palatinus, Aventinus, Calins, Exquilinus, Viminalis, Quirinalis. And although it were fo, that there could be found fuch an other, pet this Citie only was ruler ouer all Rings and Pations. Therefore it is out of all controuerfle, that it is Rome where. of John fpeaketh : yea and Rome not only as it was in times patt, while her Emperours were Trants, (which the verie Bapiffs acknowledge because they can by no meanes a. Hoibe it, but that needes they muft araunt that Rome is there meant) but as it was afterwards, when the Bope bare rule, which I will enforce out of the words them-felues : for lohn beferibeth Rome both touthing the oulb fate of the Empire. and alfo touching the flate there-of, being after renemen and refforeb, as it is eutbent in the 13. Chanter. And as fer the ruinous and becateb effate thereof, it was the Bope only that reflored it, and which gaue life brito that Image, which mas as it were fathe Dead:therefore be mentioneth and meaneth both the Rates thereof. Afterwarps, he in the 17. Chap: ter, berf. 8. fpeaketh plainelp of the Beaft which fould arife out of the bottomicfic pit . Mow as for the outs Ras mane Empire, it was in force while Iohn was pet aliue: wherefore it is moft certapne that John fpake of the Bp. thops hingbome that thould after enfue. And this is that to te fequen-

feauen-headed Beaft where-of be fpeaketh. Chus therefore it is euibent, that those things whiche Iohn heere wrote , are to be unberftobe of the kingbome and monarch of the Bilhop : other-wife , all thinges will be out of frame, and bilagree. To what ende fould I beape by many things : what neeve I abiopne unto thefe heauenly oracles. being to mamfeft, to certaine, and to many in number, the tellimonies of men , which are bucertaine and boubtfull. therefore I beere ende, gathering out of all that bath bir: Spoken, this most manifest and strong conclusion : If he be The Conclu-Antichrift which oppoleth bim-felfe bnto Chrift, which life fion with a reteth bp him-felfe againft all that is called God, or is mor petition. hipped, which hath brought an Apollacie or backfliving into the Church, which fitteth in the Temple of Bob, which boafeth him-letfe that be is God, which when the Italian and Romane Empire was ouerthowne, blurped unto bim-felfe a kingbome and tirannie, which immediatly after the afcenfion of Chift, began in his fore-runners, which fhall laft to the end of the world, which bath Sathan for bis fellow-mogker, which braggeth of his figues and wonders , counterfais teth himfelfe like unto the Lambe , and pet fpeaketh like unto the Dragon . which refforeth the Emage of the firft Beaft. which in enery respect is a right Latine, which possesseth Rome , the mufticall Babylon , the Citic with feauen billes, which is clav in Burple , which is an Warlot, and which bath all the markes of Antichitt , that are biligently and plainlie fet bowne in the Scriptures by the Spirit of God, (which of necellitie muft needes be fo , ercent we thinke that Antichiff is ill fet out by the boly Spirit:)then fathe Romane Biffop and no other, Antichift, But the antecevent (o) frif) is true. therefore the confequent (orthat that followeth) is also true. Chus haue I hitherto bandled my matter in way of propunnation , or befence : now will I alfo , by the grace of Chyin, maintaine the fame agaynft the oppugnation of battrie, that the arane Doctors thall bring agaynft it.

FINIS

Bernard a Monke of Claniacke lived about 400. yeares agoe, He wrote vnto Peter, Abbot of that Monasterie, three fatyricall inuectines : in the two latter whereof, he taketh vp roundly, and that not vniustly, the tyrannous behaulour of the Cleargie and Bishop of Rome.

Some of these verses I have copied out as they stand extantin a Booke of his, intituled, A Catalogue of witnessa of the truth: which I have caused to be written out, not fo much for the elegancie of the stile or verse, as for teflifying the truth, and to fliewe what opinion, men in those daies had of the Romane Antichrist.

L' dirther (to fueake literallie of it) the connot conceine of that netwe kinve of vitifull compaffion , which the Italian Whilitions ofe in curing the infirmities of France, They which take in hand to being our Bilhoppes , are them-felues thaken with continuall feuers. They are blinde, which make promife of fight unto orbers; And hauinathe Quinfey of concrouffies in their owne throates, Cubereby they are not able to enter in at the narrowe gate) they funnofe our men to be botchie and hugg-holdped. Thep fuffer their owne fherve to wander, and per take upon them to reclaime our fleapheards to right pathes , while they pretend , that the remedic for all fpirituall diffcales , that is , abfolition of foules and confciences, is to bee had at Rome.

Gualter Maper confuring the Pope and his Decrees, the Popilla Cleargie, and especially the Bishopps: describeth their manners in the verses following.
