An Ad of the Generall Assembly in Scot. land, the second Parliament of King CHARLES; Ordaining by Ecclefiasticall authority, the subscrip-

tion of the Confession of Faith and Covenant.



He Generall Assembly considering the great happinesse which may flow from a full and perfect Union of this Kirk and Kingdome, by joyning of all in one and the same Covenant with GOD, with the Kings Majesty, and amongst our felves, having by our great Oath declared the uprigntnesse and loyaltie of our intentions in all our proceedings, and having withall furplicated his Majesties high Commissioner, and the Lords of his Majesties honourable Privie Coun-

cell, to injoyne by Act of Councell, all the Lieges in time comming to subscribe the Confession of faith and Covenant, which as a testimony of our fidelity to God, and loyalty to our King, we have subscribed: And seeing his Majestie, high Commissioner, and the Lords of his Majesties honourable Privic Councell, have granted the defire of our Supplication, ordaining by Civill authority, all his Majesties Lieges in time comming to subscribe the foresaid Covenant, that our Union may be the more full and perfect, We by our act and constitution Ecclesiasticall, doe approve the forefaid Covenant in all the Heads and Clautes thereof and ordaines of new, under all Ecclefiasticall censure, that all the Masters of Univerficies, Colledges, and Schooles, all Schollers at the passing of their degres, all persons suspect of Papility or any other errout; and finally all the members of this Kirk and Kingdome, fublicable the fame, with thefe words prefixed to their subscription: The Article of this Covenant, inhich was at the first cubseription referred to the determination of the generall Astembly, being determined. And thereby the five Articles of Perch, the Government of the Wirk by Bishops, the civill places and power of Airk-men, upon the realons and grounds

contained in the Acts of the Generall Allembis, declared to be unloinfull within this Liek, wee subscribe according to the determination aforefait. And ordaines the Covenant, with this Declaration. to be miert in the Registers of the Assembles of this Kirk Generall, Provinciall, and Presbyteriall, ad perpetuam rei memoriam: and in all humility supplicates his Majelties high Commissioner, and the honorable Estates of Parliament, by their Authority, to ratific and injoyne the fame, under all Civill paines, which will tend to the glory of God, prefervation of Religion, the Kings Majestics honour, and perfect Peace of this Kirk and Kingdome.

The Confossion of Faith subscribed at first by the Kings Majesty and his Houshold in the years of God, 1580. Thereafter by persons of all rankes in the scure, 1581, by Ordinance of the Lords of the fecret Conneell. and Alls of the Generall Assembly. Subscribed againe by all sorts of Persons in the years 1590. By a new Ordinance of Councell, at the defire of the Generall Assembly; with a generall Band for maintenance of . the true Religion, and the Kings Perfon. And subscribed in the years 1638. By Vs, Noblomen, Barons, Gentlemen, Burgeffes, Minifters, and Commanis, then under subscribing : Together with our Resolution and Promises for the causes after specified, to maintaine the saidtrum Religion, and the Kings Majesty, according to the Confession aforesaid, and Asts of Parliament. And now upon the Supplication of the Genevall Assembly to his Majosties high Commissioner, and the Lords of his Majesties honourable Privie Councell, subscribed againe in the yeare 1639. by Ordinance of Councell, and Act of the Generall Affembly.



Ee all, and every one of Us under-written, Protest, that after long and due Examination of our own Consciences, in matters of true and falle Religion, Wee are now throughly relolved of the truth by the word and Spirit of God; And therefore we beleeve with our hearts, confesse

with our mouths, subscribe with our Hands, and constantly affirme before God, and the whole World, that this is the true Christian Faith and Religion, pleating God, and bringing Salvation to man, which now is by the mercy of God revealed to the world, by the preaching of the bleffed Evangel, and received, believed, and defended by many and fundry notable Kirks and Realmes, but chiefly by the Birk of scotland, the Kings Pajetty, and the three Chates of this Realme, as Gods Eternali Truth, and only ground of our Salvation, as more particularly



contais

is expressed in the Confession of our Faith Rablished, and publickly confirmed by fundry Acts of Parliaments, and now of a long time bath bin openly professed by the Kings Majesty, and whose body of this Realm both in Burga and Land. To the which Confession and forme of Religion we willingly agree in our consciences in all points, as onto Gods undoubted Truth and Verity, grounded onely upon his written Word. And therefore, we abhorre and detest all contrary Keligion, and Doerine: But chiefly, all kind of Papitirie, in generall and particular beads, even as they are now damned and confuted by the word of God, and Kirk of Scotland: But in speciall, we detelt and refuse the usurped authority of that Roman Antichrist upon the Scriptures of God, upon the Kirk, the civill Magistrate, and Consciences of men, all his tyrannous lawes made upon indifferent things against our Christian liberty: His erroneous Doctrine against the sufficiencie of the written Word, the perfection of the Law, the office of Christ, and his blessed Evangelifts. His corrupted Doctrine concerning original finne, our naturall inability and rebellion to Gods Law, our Justification by faith onely, our imperfect Sanctification and obedience to the Law, the nature, number and we of the Holy Sacraments: His five bastard Sacraments, with all his Rices, Ceremonies, and falle Dostrine, added to the ministration of the true Sacrament without the word of God . His cruell Judgement against Infance, departing without the Sacrament: His abfolute necessity of Baptisme: His blasphemous opinion of Fransubstantiation, or reall presence of Christs Body in the Elements, and receiving of the same by the wicked, or bodies of men: His dispensations with solemne Oathes, Perjuries and degrees of Marriaga, forbidden in the Word: His cruelry again & the innocent divorced : His diveilish Masse: His blaiphemous Priesthood: His profane sacrifice sor the sins of the dead and the quick: His Canonization of men, calling upon Angels or Saints departed, worshipping of Imagerie. Reliets and Crosses, dedicating of Kirks, Altars, Dayes, Vowes to creatures; His Purgatorie, Prayers for the dead, praying or speaking in a strange language, with his Processions, blasphemous Letany, and mutitude of Advocates or Mediators: His manifold Orders, Auricular Confessions: His delperate, and uncertaine Repontance; His generall and doubtlome Faith; His satisfactions of men for their sinnes: His Justification by works, opus operatum, works of Supererogation Merits, Pardons, Peregematious, and Stations: His holy-water baptizing of Bells, conjuring of Spirite crosling faning anointing conjuring hallowing of GODS good creatures with the superstitions opinion joyned therewith; His worldly Monarchy, and wicked Hierarchy : His three folemne vowes,

with all his shavelings of fundry forts: His erroneous and bloudy decrees made at Trent, with all the inbieribers and approvers of that cruell and bloudy Band, conjured against the Kirk of GOD: And finally, we detelt ail his vain Allegories, Rites, Signes and Traditions, brought in the Kirk, without, or against the word of GOD, and Doctrine of this true reformed Kirk: To the which we joyne our felves willing y in Doctrine, Faith, Religion, Discipline, and use of the holy Sacraments, as lively members of the same in Christ our Head: Promising and swearing by the Oreat Rame of the Load our & DD, that we shall continue in the Obedience of the Doctrine and Discipline of this Kirk, and shall defend the same according to our vocation and power all the dayes of our lives, under the paines contained in the Law, and danger both of Body and Soule, in the day of GODS fearfull Judgment: And seeing that many are stirred up by Sathan, and that Roman Antichrift, to promife, sweare, subscribe, and for a time use the holy Sacraments in the Kirk deceitfully, against their owne consciences, minding thereby, first under the eternalic cloak of Religion to corrupt and subvert secretly GODS true Religion within the Kirk, and afterward when time may ferve, to become open enemies and perfectitors of the same under vain hope of the Popes dispensation, devised against the Word of GOD, to his greater confusion, and their double condemnation in the day of the Lord Issus: Wee therefore, willing to take away all fulpition of hypocrifie, and of such double dealing with GOD and his Kirk, Protest, and call The Scarther of all hearts for witnesse, that our minds and hearts doe fully agree with this our Confession, Promise, Dath, and Subscription, so that We are not moved for any worldly respect, but are perswaded only in our consciences, through the knowledge and love of GODS true Religion, printed in our hearts by the holy Spirit, as wee shall answer to him in the day, when the secrets of all hearts shall be disclosed: And because we perceive, that the quiernesse and stability of our Religion and Kirk, doth depend upon the tifety and good behaviour of the Kings Majesty, as upon a comfortable Instrument of Gods mercy, granted to this Countrey, for the maintaining of his Kirk, and minifration of Justice a nongst us, we protest and promise with our hearts, under the same Oath, Handwrit, and paines that we shall defend his Ferson and Authority, with our goods, bodies and lives, in the defence of Christ his Evangell, Liberties of our Countrey, ministration of Justice and punishment of Iniquity against all enemies wir in this Reame.or withour, as we desire our G d'to be a strong and mercifull desender to us in the day of our death, and comming of our Lord Jesus Christ. whom with the Father, and the holy Spirit, be all Hononrand Glory Eternall.

LIKE AS many Acts of Parliament are conceived for maintenance of Gods true and Christian Religion and the purity thereof in Doctrine and Sacraments of the true Church of God, the liberty and freedome thereof, in her Nationall and Synodall affemblies, Presb. teries, Seffions, Policy. Discipline, and Iurisdiction thereof, as that purity of Religion, and liberty of the Church was u ed, professed, exercised, preached, and contessed according to the Reformation of Religion in this Realme, It is declared and ordained, feeing that Gods true Religion, and his highneste Authority are so soyned as the hurt of the one is common to both, that none shall be reputed as loyall and faithfull subjects to our Soveraign Lord, or his authority but be punishable as Rebellers and gain standers of the same, who shall not give their Confession, and make? their profession of the said true Religion, and that they who after desection shall give the Confession of their Faith of new, they shall promise to continue therein in time comming, to maintain our Soverain Lords Authority and at the intermost of their power to fortifie affit, and maintain the true Preachers and Profesiors of Christs Evangel against whatsoever Enemies and gain-standers of the same: and namely, against all fuch (of whatsoever Nation, estate, or degree they be of) that have ioyned, and bound themselves, or have affilted, or affilt to set forward and execute the cruel decrees of the Councell of Trent, contrary to the true Preachers and Professors of the Word of God, which is repeated word by word in the Articles of Pacification at Perth the 23 of February 1572-approved by Parliament the last of Aprill 1573 ratified in Parliament 1587. and related. Act 123. Parl. 12. of K. Fames 6. with his addition, that they are bound to refire all treasonable uproares and hostilities railed against the trueReligion, the Kings Maiesty & the trueProfessors.

Like as all Leidges are bound to maintain the Kings Maieslies Royall Person, and Authority, the Authority of Parliaments without the which neither any Lawes or lawfull Judicatories can be established, Act 130 and 131. Parl. 8 K. Iames 6. and the subjects liberties, who ought one y to live and be governed by the Kingslawes, the common lawes of this Realm allanerly. Act 48. Parl. 3. K. Iames the first Act. 79 Parl. 6. K. James 4. repeated in the Act 131. Parl. 8 K. Iames 6. Which, if they be innovated or prejudged the Commission anent the Union of two Kingdomes of Scotland and England, which is the sole Act of the 17. Parl. of K. Iames 6. declares such consustion would ensue, as this Realm could be no more a free Monarchy, because by the fundamentall lawes, ancient priviledges, Offices, and liberties of this Kingdom, not only the Princely

Authority of his Majesties Royall descent hath been these many ages maintained, but also the peoples fecurity of their Lands, livings, rights, offices, liberties and dignities preferved. And therefore for the prefervation of the faid true Religion, Lawes and liberties of this Kingdome, is statute by the 8. Act Parl. 1 repeated in the 90 Act Parl. 7. Ratified. in the 23 Act Parl. IV. and IIA. Act, Parl. 12.0f K, James 6. and 4. Act of K. Charles, that all Kings and Princes at their Coronation and reception of their Princely Authority, shall make their faithfull promise by: their solemne Oath in the presence of Eternall God, that, enduring the whole time of their lives, they shall serve the same eternall God to the unermost of their power, according as he hath required in his most holy Word contained in the Old and New Testament: And according to the same Word, shall maintaine the true Religion of Christ Jesus, the preaching of his holy Word, the due and right ministration of the Sacraments now received and preached within this Realme (according to the Confession of Faith immediately preceding) and shall abolish and gain-fland all false Religion contrary to the same, and shall rule the people, committed to their charge, according to the will and command of GOD, revealed in his forefaid Word and according to the laudable Laworand Conflicutions received in this Realme, no wayes repugnant to the faid will of the eternall GOD; and shall procure, to the uttermost of their power, to the Kirk of GOD, and whole Christian people, true and perfect peace in all time comming: and that they shall be carefull to root out of their Empire all Hereticks, and Enemies to the true worship of GOD, who shall be convicted by the true Kirk of GOD, of the foresaid crimes, which was also observed by his Majesty, athis Coronation at Edinburg, 1633. as may be seen in the Order of the Coronation.

And because we cannot look for a blessing from God upon our proceedings, except with our profession and subscription we joyne such a life and conversation as betteemeth Christians, who have renewed their Covenant with God; We therefore faithfully promise, for our selves, our followers, and all others under us, both in publike in our particular families, and personall carriage, to endeavour to keep our selves within the bounds of Christian liberty, and to be good examples to others of all Godlinesse, Sobernesse and Righteonshesse, and of every duty we owe to God and Man. And that this our Vnion and Comunction may be observed without violation, We call the living GOD the Searcher of our Hearts, to witnesse, who knoweth this to be our sincere Desire, and unfained Resolution, as we shall answer to JES USCHRIST, in the great Day, and under the paine of GODS everlassing wrath, and



and of infamy, and losse of all honour and respect in this World, Most humbly beforeing the Lord, to strengthen us by his holy Spirit for this end, and to blesse our defires and receedings with a happy incesse, that Religion and Righteoninesse may flourish in the Land. to the glory of GOD the honour of our King, and peace and comfort of us all. In witnesse whereof we have subscribed with our hands all the premises.

"He Estates of Parliament presently conveened by his Majesties spe-1 ciall Authority, Gonsidering the Honour, Dignity and Authority of the supreame Court of Parliament, over the Councell and Seffion and all other civill Judicatories of this Kingdome, which have their originall, their power and antiquity from the Kings Maleily and the Estates of Parliament is subordinate thereunto, and ought to be countible and censurable by them, for their abusing of their power, to the prejudice of the Countrey: For the weale whereof they were established, according to the twelfth Act of the second Parliament of King James A. wherein the Kings Councell was fworne in presence of the three Estates. to give his Highnesse a true and estand Councell, in all matters, concerning his Majesty and his Realm; And to be responsall and accusable to the King and his Estates of their Counsell, Considering also, that during his Majesties absence forth of this Kingdom it is most necessary for the publick peace of this Kingdom and his Maieflies honour, that all mis-informers, railers, and entertainers of Jealousies suspitions, and divisions betwixt the King, this Kirk and Kingdome, should be severely punished, and especially all bad Counsellors, who instead of giving his Majesty & true and effauld Counfeil hath given or will give information and counfell to the evident prejudice and ruine of the liberties of this Kirkand King dome, should be exemplarly Judged and censured by the Kings Majesty and the Estates of Parliament. Therefore they renew and revive all Acts of Parliament made against Liefing-Makers, raisers and entertainers of Jealousies, contentions, and divisions betwirt the Kings Maielly and this Kirk and Kingdome. And declares, that no dignity, quality, place, or office whatfoever shall exceme these or any person whatfoever from the centure of the faid Acts.
