(2) An A& of the Generall' Affembly in Scot. land, the fecond Parliament of King CHARLES; Ordaining by Ecclefiafticall authority, the fublcription of the Confession of Faith and Covenant.



He Generall Affembly confidering the great happinesse which may flow from a full and perfect Union of this Kirk and Kingdome, by joyning of all in one and the fame Covenant with GOD, with the Kings Majefty, and amongst our felves, having by our great Oath declared the uprightneffe and loyaltie of our intentions in all our proceedings, and having withall furplicated bis Majeflies high Commiffigner, and the Lords of his Majefties honourab'e Privie Coun-

cell, to injoyne by Act of Councell, all the Lieges in time comming to subscribe the Confession of faith and Covenant, which as a testimony of our fidelity to God, and loyalty to our King, we have fubfcribed : And feeing his Majeflie, high Commissioner, and the Lords of his Majeflies honourable Privie Councell, have granted the defire of our Supplication, ordaining by Civill anthority, all his Majellies Lieges in time comming to subscribe the foresaid Covenant, that our Union may be the more full and perfect, We by our act and conflicution Ecclefiafficall, doe approve the forefaid Covenant in all the Heads and Clautes there of and ordaines of new, under all Ecclesiafticall cenfure, that all the Maffers of Univerficies, Colledges, and Schooles, all Schollers at the paffing of their degries, all perions fuiped of Papility, or any other errour ; and finally all . the members of this Kirk and Kingdome, fubleribe the fame, with thefe words prefixed to their fubfcription : The Article of this Covenant, which was at the first fabscription referred to the determination of the generall Affembly, being determined. And thereby the five Articles of Perth, the Government of the Mirk by Bifbons, the cibill places and power of Airk-men, upon the realons and grounds contata

contained in the Ads of the Generall Adembly, declared to be unlainfull within this kirk. We fabferibe according to the determis nation afosefaid, And ordaines the Covenant, with this Declaration. to be miert in the Registers of the Astemblies of this Kirk Generall, Provinciall, and Presbyteriall, ad perpetuam rei memoriam: and in all humility supplicates his Majelties high Commillioner, and the honorable Effates of Parliament, by their Authority, to ratifie and injoyne the fame, under all Civill paines, which will tend to the glory of God, prefervation of Religion, the Kings Majeltics honour, and perfect Peace of this Kirk and Kingdome.

The Confossion of Faith subscribed at first by the Kings Majesty and his Houshold in the years of God, 1580. Thereafter by performs of all rankes in the scare, 1581, by Ordinance of the Lords of the fecret Conneell. and Atts of the Generall Allembly. Subscribed againe by all forts of Perfons in the years 1590. By a new Ordinance of Councell, at the defire of the Generall A fembly ; with a generall Band for maintenance of . the true Religion, and the Kings Perfon. , And fubforibed in the years 1638. By Vs. Noblomen. Barons, Gentlemen, Burgeffes, Minifeers, and Commans, then under (ub (cribing : Together with our Refolution and Promifes for the causes after specified, to maintaine the faid true Religion, and the Kings Majesty, according to the Confession aforesaid, and Asts of Parliament. And now upon the Supplication of the Genevall Affembly to his Majefties high Commiffioner, and the Lords of his Majestics honourable Privie Councell, subscribed againe in the yeare 1639. by Ordinance of Councell, and Act of the Generall Affembly.

Ee all, and every one of Us under-written, Proteft, that after long and due Examination of our own Confeiencer, in matters of true and falle Religion, Wee are now throughly reiolved of the truth by the word and Spirit of God; And therefore we beleeve with our hearts confetle with our mouths, subscribe with our Hands , and constantly affirme before God, and the whole World, that this is the true Christian Faith and Religion, pleasing God, and bringing Salvation to man, which now is by the mercy of God revealed to the world, by the preaching of the bleffed Evangel, and received, believed, and defended by many and fune dry notable Kirks and Realmes, but chiefly by the Birk of Scotland, the Kings Pajetty, and the these E fates of this Realme, as Gods Eternall Truth, and only ground of our Salvation, as more particularly

is expressed in the Confession of our Faith stablished, and publickiy confirmed by fundry Acts of Parliaments, and now of a long time hath bin openly profelled by the Kings Majelty , and whole body of this Realm both in Burgh and Land. To the which Confellion and forme of Religion we willingly agree in our confeiences in all points, as onto Gods undoubted Truth and Verity, grounded onely upon his written Word. And therefore, we abhorre and deter all contrary Keligion, and Doetrine : But chiefly, all kind of Papitirie, in generall and particular heads, even as they are now damned and confliced by the Word of God, and Kirk of Scotland : But in speciall, we deteft and refue the surped authority of that Roman Antichrift upon the Scriptures of God, upon the Kirk, the civill Magistrate, and Confciences of men, all his tyrannous lawes made upon indifferent things againft our Christian liberty : His erroneous Doctrine against the sufficiencie of the written Word, the perfection of the Law, the office of Chrift, and his bleffed Evangelifts. His corrupted Doctrine concerning originall finne, our naturall inability and rebellion to Gods Law, our Justification by faith onely, our imperfect Sanctification and obedience to the Law, the nature, number and we of the Holy Sacraments : His five bastard Sacraments, with all his Rites, Ceremonies, and falle Dostrine, added to the ministration of the true Sacrament without the word of God His cruell Jadgement against Infants, departing without the Sactament : His abfoluce necessity of Baptisme : His blasphemous opinion of Fransubstantiation, or reall prefence of Chrifts Body in the Elements, and receiving of the fame by the wicked, or bodies of men : His difpentations with folemne Oathes, Perjuries and degrees of Marriage, forbidden in the Word : His cruelry again & the innocent divorced : His diveilifh Malle : His blaiphemous Priesthood : His profane facrifice for the fins of the dead and the quick : His Canonization of men, calling upon Angels or Saints departed, worthipping of Imagerie. Relicts and Croffes, dedicating of Kirks, Altars, Dayes, Vowes to creatures; His Purgatorie, Prayers for the dead, praying or speaking in a frange language, with his Proceffions, blafphentous Letany, and mutitude of Advocates or Mediators : His manifold Orders, Anticular Confessions: His delperate, and uncertaine Repontance; His generall and doubtiome Faith ; His facisfactions of men for their finnes : His Jullification by works, opus operatum, works of Supererogation Merits. Pardons, Peregematious, and Stations : His holy-water baptizing of Bells, conjuring of Spirite croffing faning anointing.conjuring hallowing of GODS good creatures with the superstitions opinion joyned there with; His worldly Monarchy, and wicked Hierarchy : His three folemne vowes, with

with all his fhavelings of fundry forts : His erroneous and bloudy decrees made at Trent, with all the fubfcribers and approvers of that cruell and bloudy Band, conjured against the Kirk of GOD : And finally, we detelt all his vain Allegories, Rites, Signes and Traditions, brought in the Kirk, without, or against the word of GOD, and Doctrine of this true reformed Kirk: To the which we joyne our feives willing y in Doctrine, Faith, Religion, Discipline, and use of the holy Sacraments, aslively members of the fame in Chrift our Head: Promifing and fwearing by the Oreat Rame of the Lozd our ODD, that we shall continue in the Obedience of the Doctrine and Discipline of this Kirk, and shall defend the same according to our vocation and power all the dayes of our lives, under the paines contained in the Law, and danger both of Body and Soule, in the day of GODS fearfull Judgment : And feeing that many are ftirred up by Sathan, and that Roman Antichrift, to promife, fweare, fubscribe, and for a time use the holy Sacraments in the Kirk deceitfully, against their owne confeiences, minding thereby, firA under the eternall cloak of Religion to corrupt and subvert fecretly GODS true Religion within the Kirk, and afterward when time may ferve, to become open enemies and perfectetors of the fame under vain hope of the Popes difpenfation, devifed against the Word of GOD, to his greater confusion, and their double condemnation in the day of the LORD JESUS: Wee. therefore, willing to take away all infpition of hypocrific, and of such double dealing with GOD and his Kirk, Proteit, and call The Scarther of all hearts for witnesse, that our minds and hearts doe fully agree with this our Confession, Pzomite, Dath, and Gubstription, fo that We are not moved for any worldly respect, but are periwaded only in our confciences through the knowledge and love of GODS true Religion, printed in our hearts by the holy Spirit, as wee shall answer to him in the day, when the fecrets of all hearts (hall be difcloted : And because we perceive, that the quiernesse and stability of our Religion and Kirk, doth depend upon the lifety and good behaviour of the Kings Majefty, as upon a comfortable Inffrument of Gods mercy, granted to this Countrey, for the maintaining of his Kirk, and minifiration of Justice a nongst us, we protest and promise with our hearts, under the same Oath, H. ndwrit, and paines that we shall defend his Person and Authority, with our goods, bodies and lives, in the defence of Chrift his Evangell, Liberties of our Countrey, ministration of Justice and punishment of iniquity against all enemies wit in this Reame.or withour, as Ne defire our G d'to be a ftrong and mercifull desen ler to us in the day of our death, and comming of our Lord JESUS CHRIST : To whom:

whom with the Father, and the holy Spirit, be all Hononr and Glory Eternall.

LIKE AS many Acts of Parliament are conceived for maintenance of Gods true and Christian Religion and the purity thereof in Doctrine and Sacraments of the true Church of God, the liberty and freedome thereof, in her Nationall and Synodall affemblies, Presb. teries, Seffions, Folicy. Difeipline, and Iurifdiction thereof, as that purity of Religion, and liberty of the Church was u ed, profeffed, exercised, preached, and contessed according to the Reformation of Religion in this Realme, It is declared and ordained, feeing that Gods true Religion, and his highnesseAuthority are to joyned as the hurt of the one is common to both, that none shall be reputed as loyall and faithfull subjects to our Soveraign Lord, or his authority but be punishable as Rebellers and gain standers of the fame, who shall not give their Confession, and make their profession of the faid true Religion, and that they who after defection shall give the Confession of their Faith of new, they shall promite to continue therein in time comming, to maintain our Soverain Lords Authority and at the intermost of their power to fortifie affit, and maintain the true Preachers and Professors of Christs Evangel against whatfoever Enemies and gain-flanders of the fame : and namely, against all fuch (of whatfoever Nation, effate, or degree they be of) that have ioyned, and bound them elves, or have affilted, or affilt to fet forward and execute the cruel decrees of the Councell of Trent, contrary to the true Preachers and Proteflois of the Word of God, which is repeated word by word in the Articles of Pacification at Perth the 23 of February 1572. approved by Parliament the laft of Apzill 1573. ratified in Parliament 1587. and related. Act 123. Parl. 12. of K. James 6. with his addition, that they are bound to refit all treasonable uproares and hosfilities railed against the trueReligion, the Kings Maiesty & the trueProfeffors.

Like as all Leidges are bound to maintain the Kings Maieflies Royall. Perfon, and Authority, the Authority of Parliaments without the which neither any Lawes or lawfull Judicatories can be effablished, Act 1 30 and 131. Parl. 8 K. Iames 6. and the subjects liberties, who ought one y to live and be governed by the Kingslawes, the common lawes of this Realm allanerly. Act 48. Parl. 3. K. Iames the first Act. 79 Parl. 6. K. James 4. repeated in the Act 1 31. Parl. 8 K. Iames 6. Which, if they be innovated or prejudged the Commission anent the Union of two Kirgdomes of Scotland and England, which is the fole Act of the 17. Parl. of K. Iames 6. declares such confusion would ensue, as this Realm could be no more a free Monarchy, because by the fundamentall lawes, ancient priviledges, Offices, and liberties of this Kingdom, not only the Princely Actho-

Authority of his Majeflies Royall defcent hath been thefe many ages maintained, but also the peoples fecurity of their Lands, livings, rights, offices, liberties and dignities preferved. And therefore for the prefervation of the faid true Religion, Lawes and liberties of this Kingdome, is statute by the 8. Act Parl. 1. repeated in the 90 AEt Parl. 7. Ratified. in the 23 Alt Parlix. and 114. Alt, Parlizof K, James 6 and 4. Alt of K. Charles, that all Kings and Princes at their Coronation and reception of their Princely Authority, fhall make their faithfull promife by their folemne Oath in the prefence of Eternall God, that, enduring the whole time of their lives, they shall ferve the fame eternall God to the utermost of their power, according as he hath required in his most holy Word contained in the Old and New Teltament : And according to the fame Word, shall maintaine the true Religion of Christ Jesus, the preaching of his holy Word, the due and right ministration of the Sacraments now received and preached within this Realme (according to the Confellion of Faith immediately preceding) and shall abolish and gain-fland all falle Religion contrary to the fame, and fhall rule the people, committed to their charge, according to the will and command of GOD, revealed in his forefaid Word and according to the laudable Lawos and Conflicutions received in this Realme, no wayes repugnant. to the faid will of the eternall GOD; and fhall procure, to the uttermost of their power, to the Kirk of GOD and whole Christian people, true and perfect peace in all time comming: and that they shall be carefull to root out of their Empire all Hereticks, and Enemies to the true worship of GOD, who shall be convided by the true Kirk of GOD, of the forelaid crimes, which was also observed by his Majelty, athis Coronation at Edinburg, 1633. as may be seen in the Order of the Coronation.

And because we cannot look for a bleffing from God upon our proceedings, except with our profeffion and fubficiption we joyne fuch a life and convertation as bettemeth Christians, who have renewed their Covenant with God; We therefore faithfully promile, for our felves, our followers, and all others under us, both in publike in our particular families, and perfonall carriage, to endeavour to keep our felves within the bounds of Christian liberty, and to be good examples to others of all Godlineffe, Soberneffe and Righteonsfielfe, and of every duty we owe to God and Man. And that this our Vnien and Comunition may be observed without violation, We call the living GOD: the Searcher of our Hearts, to witneffe, who knoweth this to be our fincere Defire, and unfained Refolution, as we fhalt answer to JES us CHRIST, in the great Day, and under the paine of GODS everlasting wrath, and

and of infamy, and loss of all honour and respect in this World, Most humbly betweening the Lord, to strengthen us by his holy Spirit for this end, and to bleffe our defires and proceedings with a happy incess, that Religion and Righteouinesse may flourish in the Land. to the glory of GOD, the honour of our King, and peace and comfort of us all. In withesse whereof we have subscribed with our hands all the premisses.

"He Estates of Parliament presently conveened by his Majeslies speciall Authority, Gonfidering the Honour, Dignity and Authonity of the supreame Court of Parliament, over the Councell and Seffion and all other civill Judicatories of this Kingdome, which have their originall, their power and antiquity from the Kings Maleity and the Estates of Parliament is subordinate thereunto, and ought to be countable and centurable by them, for their abufing of their power, to the prejudice of the Countrey : For the weale whereof they were established, according to the twelfth Act of the fecond Parliament of King James 4. wherein the Kings Councell was fworne in prefence of the three Effates, to give his Highneffe a true and effauldCouncell, in all matters, concerning his Majefty, and his Realm; And to be responsall and acculable to the King and his Effates of their Counfell, Confidering alfo, that during his Majeffies absence forth of this Kingdom it is most necessary for the publick peace of this Kingdom and his Maieflies honour, that all mif-informers, railers, and entertainers of Jealoufies fuspitions, and divisions betwixt the King, this Kirk and Kingdome, should be leverely punified, and especially all bad Counfellors, who instead of giving his Majefty a true and effauld Counfeil hath given or will give information and counfell to the evident prejudice and ruine of the liberties of this Kirkand King lome, fhouid be exemplarly Judged and centured by the Kings Majefty and the Effates of Parliament. Therefore they renew and revive all Acts of Parliament made against Liefing-Makers, raisers and entertainers of Jealoufies, contentions, and divisions betwixt the Kings Maielly and this Kirk and Kingdome. And declares, that no dignity, quality, place, or office whatfoever fhall exceme thefe or any perfon whatfoever from the centure of the faid Acts.

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
